AN ACT

To amend chapter 304, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to certification standards for law enforcement officials who enforce commercial motor vehicle laws.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 304, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 304.232, to read as follows:

304.232. 1. The Missouri state highway patrol shall establish

- procedures for the certification of municipal police officers, sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, and other law enforcement officials to enforce the
- 4 commercial motor vehicle safety laws and regulations of this state.
- 5 2. The certification procedures established by the Missouri state 6 highway patrol shall include, but not be limited to:
- 7 (1) Initial and maintenance of certification, to include:
- 8 (a) Training;
- 9 (b) Recurring training, to be conducted minimally on an annual 10 basis;
- 11 (c) Testing; and
- 12 (d) On-the-job experience under the supervision of a certified 13 law enforcement official or field training officer;
- 14 (2) Delineation of roles and responsibilities within the specific
- agency, as well as the coordination with the Missouri state highway 16 patrol;
- 17 (3) Data collection and maintenance and upload to state 18 information systems;
- 19 (4) Computer hardware, software, and communications systems 20 shall be compatible with those of the Missouri state highway patrol;

- 21 (5) Prescribed use of forms and other official documents related 22 to the certification;
- 23 (6) Fine and sanction structure that is similar to that of the Missouri state highway patrol; and 24
 - (7) Disposition of moneys generated by fines.
- 26 3. The certification procedures shall meet the requirements of the memorandum of understanding between the state of Missouri and 27the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance or any successor organization. 28
- 4. The commercial motor vehicle safety enforcement and inspection activities of all law enforcement officials of a political subdivision of the state of Missouri shall conform to the memorandum of understanding between the state of Missouri and the Commercial 32Vehicle Safety Alliance, as appropriate.
- 34 5. Commercial motor vehicle safety data collection, management 35 and distribution by law enforcement officials of a political subdivision of the state of Missouri shall support the information systems of the 36 Missouri state highway patrol. 37
- 38 6. The Missouri state highway patrol shall establish reasonable 39 fees sufficient to recover from a political subdivision of the state of 40 Missouri the cost of training, recurring training, data collection and management, certifying, and additional administrative functions for law enforcement officials certified under this section. The Missouri 43 state highway patrol may apply for any applicable reimbursement or incentive funds that may be available under the motor carrier safety 44 assistance program to fund the certification training program outlined 45 in this section. 46
 - 7. The agencies for which law enforcement officials certified under this section work for shall, to the extent practicable, adhere to the same Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program requirements under 49 Code of Federal Regulations Part 350 of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations.
 - 8. The agencies for which law enforcement officials certified under this section work for shall be subject to periodic program reviews and, at the discretion of the Missouri state highway patrol, be required to submit a commercial vehicle safety plan that is consistent with and incorporated into the statewide enforcement plan.
 - 9. Beginning July 1, 2007, no law enforcement officer may make

an arrest, issue a citation, or conduct a commercial motor vehicle 58 59 roadside inspection to determine compliance with the applicable commercial motor vehicle laws under this chapter, chapter 307, or any 60 statute or regulation relating to the enforcement of a commercial motor 61 vehicle law unless the law enforcement officer has satisfactorily 62 completed, as a part of his or her training, the basic course of 63 instruction developed by the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance and 64 has been certified by the Missouri state highway patrol under this 65 66 section. Law enforcement officers authorized to enforce commercial motor vehicle laws shall annually receive in-service training related to 67 commercial motor vehicle operations, including but not limited to 68 training in current federal motor carrier safety regulations, safety 69 inspection procedures, and out-of-service criteria. The annual training 70 71requirements shall be designated and specified by the superintendent of the highway patrol. 72

10. The superintendent of the state highway patrol shall promulgate rules and regulations necessary to administer the certification procedures and any other provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2006, shall be invalid and void.
