AN ACT

To repeal section 252.040, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to poaching, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 252.040, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 252.040, to read as follows:

252.040. 1. No wildlife shall be pursued, taken, killed, possessed or

2 disposed of except in the manner, to the extent and at the time or times

B permitted by such rules and regulations; and any pursuit, taking, killing,

possession or disposition thereof, except as permitted by such rules and

5 regulations, are hereby prohibited.

2. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor [except that] with the following exceptions:

8 (1) Any person violating any of the rules and regulations pertaining to 9 record keeping requirements imposed on licensed fur buyers and fur dealers shall

10 be guilty of an infraction and shall be fined not less than ten dollars nor more

11 than one hundred dollars; and

12 (2) Any person violating the provisions of this section while

13 entering or remaining unlawfully upon the real property of another

individual shall be subject to a fine of five hundred dollars and shall

pay restitution to the property owner for any property damage

16 resulting in a lower property value. If the person who violates the

provisions of this section while trespassing does not pay the fine or

18 restitution imposed by the court in the time and manner prescribed by

19 the court, the court shall submit the name of the violator to the

- 21 shall be suspended or revoked until the decision is made by the
- 22 commission to lift that suspension or allow the person to apply for a
