To repeal section 172.287, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the extension of the grant program regarding the University of Missouri's capital improvements for its engineering programs.

of engineering from such nonstate sources exceed the amount necessary to reach

the maximum dollar limits herein specified, such excess amounts will be carried

- 3. In the event that the appropriations for this grant program are
- 21 insufficient to fund all grants approved for a given fiscal year, all such grants
- 22 shall be reduced pro rata as necessary.
