To repeal section 115.427, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to voter identification.

AN ACT

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 115.427, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 115.427, to read as follows:

115.427. 1. Before receiving a ballot, voters shall identify themselves by
presenting a form of personal **photographic** identification from the following
list:

4 (1) Identification issued by the state of Missouri, an agency of the state, 5 or a local election authority of the state;

6 (2) Identification issued by the United States government or agency 7 thereof;

8 (3) Identification issued by an institution of higher education, including 9 a university, college, vocational and technical school, located within the state of 10 Missouri;

(4) [A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check,
paycheck or other government document that contains the name and address of
the voter:

14 (5)] Driver's license or state identification card issued by another state;15 or

[(6)] (5) Other photographic identification approved by the secretary
of state under rules promulgated pursuant to subsection 3 of this section or other
photographic identification approved by federal law.

Personal knowledge of the voter by two supervising election judges, one from each 1920major political party, shall be acceptable voter identification upon the completion 21of a secretary of state-approved affidavit that is signed by both supervisory 22election judges and the voter that attests to the personal knowledge of the voter by the two supervisory election judges. The secretary of state may provide by 23rule for a sample affidavit to be used for such purpose. 24252. All election authorities of the state shall issue, free of charge, an official photographic voter identification card to any registered 2627voter who cannot meet the identification requirements set forth in subsection 1 of this section. 28293. The precinct register shall serve as the voter identification certificate. The following form shall be printed at the top of each page of the 30 31precinct register: 32VOTER'S IDENTIFICATION CERTIFICATE 33Warning: It is against the law for anyone to vote, or attempt to vote, without having a lawful right to vote. 3435PRECINCT WARD OR TOWNSHIP 36

[3.] 4. The secretary of state shall promulgate rules to effectuate the 42provisions of this section. 43

44 [4.] 5. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall 45become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of 46 chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and 47chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the 4849general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, 50then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after 5152August 28, 2002, shall be invalid and void.

53[5.] 6. If any voter is unable to sign his name at the appropriate place on the certificate or computer printout, an election judge shall print the name and 54address of the voter in the appropriate place on the precinct register, the voter 55

- 56 shall make his mark in lieu of signature, and the voter's mark shall be witnessed
- 57 by the signature of an election judge.



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
