AN ACT

To amend chapter 170, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to the financial independence through education act.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 170, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 170.122, to read as follows:

170.122. 1. This act shall be known, and may be cited, as the "Financial Independence Through Education Act".

- 2. Regular courses of instruction in the area of personal finance shall be offered in all public schools in the state of Missouri and shall begin not later than the ninth grade and continue for each year of high school. The topics covered in such personal finance courses shall include, but not necessarily be limited to, the following: banking, checking and savings accounts, credit cards, interest rates, pensions
- 9 and retirement savings, social security, property and life insurance,
- 10 and the stock market.
- 3. Beginning in the 2007-2008 school year and each year thereafter, local school districts maintaining high schools shall comply with the provisions of this section by offering in grades nine, ten, eleven, and twelve a course of instruction in personal finance.
- 4. Local school districts shall require that prior to the completion of the twelfth grade each pupil who receives a high school diploma or certificate of graduation on or after January 1, 2011, shall have satisfactorily completed, with a passing grade, four year-long courses in personal finance education. The department of elementary and secondary education may promulgate rules regarding the implementation and enforcement of this section and shall provide

22 assistance in developing personal finance courses if a district requests 23 assistance.

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245. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated in this 25section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to 26all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 27536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable 28and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to 2930 chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to 31 disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or 32adopted after August 28, 2006, shall be invalid and void.
