AN ACT

To repeal section 327.391, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to professional engineer and land surveyor licenses.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 327.391, RSMo, is repealed and one new section
2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 327.391, to read as follows:

327.391. 1. The board shall, upon application, issue a **professional land**
2 **surveying** license to any [engineer or professional land surveyor who is at least
3 fifty years of age] **individual**, who has at least twenty years of satisfactory
4 experience, and who passes [a written examination or holds a degree at the
5 bachelor's level or higher in engineering or science and passes an oral
6 examination] **the fundamentals of land surveying examination, the**
7 **principles and practice of land surveying examination, and the**
8 **Missouri state specific examination**, provided that any such application is
9 accompanied by the required fee.

10 2. The board shall, upon application, issue a **professional**
11 **engineering** license to any individual who holds a degree at the
12 **bachelor's level or higher in engineering, has at least twenty years of**
13 **satisfactory engineering experience, and passes part two of the written**
14 **examination, as provided in section 327.241, provided that any such**
15 **application is accompanied by the required fee.**

16 3. The board shall, upon application, issue a **professional**
17 **engineering** license to any individual who holds a degree from an
18 **engineering accreditation commission/accreditation board for**
19 **engineering and technology accredited program or its equivalent, a**

20 doctorate in engineering from an institution that offers engineering
21 accreditation commission/accreditation board for engineering and
22 technology programs, and passes part two of the written exam, as
23 provided in section 327.241, provided that any such application is
24 accompanied by the required fee. The doctorate degree must be
25 approved by the board for the candidate to qualify.
