AN ACT

To authorize the conveyance of property owned by the state known as the Midtown state office building to St. Louis University, with an emergency clause.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section 1. 1. The governor is hereby authorized and empowered to sell, transfer, grant, convey, remise, release, and forever quit claim all interest in property owned by the state of Missouri known as the Midtown state office building to St. Louis University. The property to be conveyed is more particularly described as follows:

A tract of land being part of Theresa Avenue, situated
between City Blocks 1058 and 1059 and part of an Alley in
City Block 1059 of the City of St. Louis, Missouri being
more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the Southern Right of Way 10 line of Olive Street, 60 feet wide, and the Eastern right of 11 12way line of Theresa Avenue, said point being the Northwestern corner of a tract of land conveyed to Saint 13Louis University by Deed recorded in Book M1236, Page 14 151254 of the St. Louis City Records; thence along said Eastern right of way line, South 14 degrees 58 minutes 48 16 seconds West, 71.02 feet to a point on the Northern Right 17 of Way Line of Lindell Boulevard, 100 feet wide; thence 18along said Northern right of way line, North 74 degrees 03 19 minutes 53 seconds West, 48.50 feet to a point; thence 2021North 75 degrees 14 minutes 42 seconds West, 186.03 feet to

22a point on the Western Line of that portion of Theresa 23Avenue established by City Ordinance Number 39980; thence along said Western Line, North 79 degrees 56 2425minutes 00 seconds East, 34.49 feet to a point; thence North 16 degrees 01 minute 30 seconds East, 20.21 feet to a point 2627on the Southern Line of the ten foot wide alley in City Block 1059; thence along said Southern Line, North 68 2829degrees 25 minutes 15 seconds West, 150.63 feet to a point 30 on the Eastern Line of that portion of the alley vacated by City Ordinance Number 58135; thence along said Eastern 31Line, North 16 degrees 07 minutes 00 seconds East, 10.05 32feet to a point on the Northern Line of the ten foot wide 3334alley; thence along said Northern line, South 68 degrees 25 35minutes 15 seconds East, 165.24 feet to a point on the Southern line of a tract of land conveyed to Saint Louis 36 37 University by Deed recorded in Book M1447, Page 1565 of the St. Louis City Records; thence along said Southern 38 39 Line, South 16 degrees 12 minutes 47 seconds East, 13.92 feet to a point; thence South 68 degrees 25 minutes 12 4041 seconds East, 10.69 feet to a point; thence North 87 degrees 4238 minutes 51 seconds East, 73.55 feet to a point; thence 43North 48 degrees 23 minutes 44 seconds East 45.42 feet to 44 a point on the Southern Right of Way Line of Olive Street, 45as aforementioned; thence along said Southern Right of Way Line, South 60 degrees 53 minutes 16 seconds East, 4677.49 feet to the point of beginning, containing 13,594 4748

square feet (0.312 acres, more or less).

492. The commissioner of administration shall set the terms and conditions for the sale as the commissioner deems reasonable. Such 50terms and conditions may include, but not be limited to, the time, place, 5152and terms of the sale.

533. The attorney general shall approve the form of the instrument of conveyance. 54

Section B. Because of the need to continue the economic development efforts in downtown St. Louis, section A of this act is deemed necessary for the $\mathbf{2}$ immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace and safety, and is 3 hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, 4
