AN ACT

To repeal sections 388.600, 388.605, 388.615, and 388.645, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof four new sections relating to railroad policemen.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 388.600, 388.605, 388.615, and 388.645, RSMo, are

- 2 repealed and four new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections
- 3 388.600, 388.605, 388.615, and 388.645, to read as follows:

388.600. Any railroad company may apply to the [superintendent of the

- 2 Missouri state highway patrol] director of the department of public safety
- 3 for appointment of one or more of its employees of the age twenty-one or over,
- 4 who regularly work in this state and who are residents of this state, or of an
- 5 adjoining state, as railroad policemen for the purpose of protecting the property
- 6 of the railroad, or property for which it is responsible, and for the purpose of
- 7 protecting the persons and property of its passengers and employees.

388.605. The application for the appointment of railroad policemen shall

- 2 be in such form as the [superintendent of the Missouri state highway patrol]
- 3 director of the department of public safety may prescribe and shall include
- 4 a statement in such detail as the [superintendent of the Missouri state highway
- 5 patroll director of the department of public safety may require as to the
- 6 age, education, training in law enforcement and experience of each employee for

whom appointment is requested. Each application shall be signed by an officer of the railroad company and by each employee for whom appointment is requested. Each application shall be accompanied by the statements of three reputable citizens of the state of Missouri attesting to the moral character of each employee for whom appointment is requested. A fee of fifteen dollars for each employee for whom appointment is requested shall be filed with the application

388.615. Each railroad policeman shall file with the [superintendent of the state highway patrol] director of the department of public safety his photograph, fingerprints and signature.

to defray the expenses of processing the application.

388.645. When a railroad no longer requires the services of a policeman so appointed, it shall file a notice of termination of employment with the [superintendent of the Missouri state highway patrol] director of the department of public safety, or at any time the [superintendent of the Missouri state highway patrol] director of the department of public safety may revoke the appointment by giving notice to the railroad and to the railroad policeman. Thereupon, the powers of such policeman shall cease.
