AN ACT

To repeal sections 335.212 and 335.233, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to certain nursing and teaching student assistance programs.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 335.212 and 335.233, RSMo, are repealed and three 2 new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 173.232, 335.212, 3 and 335.233, to read as follows:

173.232. 1. There is hereby established the "Urban Flight and 2 Rural Needs Scholarship Program", which shall be administered by the 3 department of elementary and secondary education. The program shall, 4 upon appropriation, provide scholarships, subject to the eligibility 5 criteria enumerated in this section, for eligible students who enter a 6 teacher education program and make a commitment to teach as a 7 condition of receiving such scholarship.

8 2. Subject to appropriation, each year the department of 9 elementary and secondary education shall make available to eligible 10 students up to one hundred four-year urban flight and rural needs 11 scholarships in an amount that encompasses one hundred percent of 12 the total cost of eligible students' tuition and fees at a four-year college 13 or university located in Missouri. Such amount shall be paid by funds 14 appropriated to the department.

3. As used in this section, the term "eligible student" shall meanan individual who:

17 (1) Is a United States citizen and a Missouri resident who 18 attended a Missouri high school; HCS SB 980

19 (2) Enters and makes a commitment to pursue a teacher 20 education program approved by the department of elementary and 21 secondary education and offered by a four-year college or university 22 located in Missouri;

(3) Signs an agreement with the department of elementary and
secondary education in which the recipient agrees to teach in a
Missouri public school, the population of which includes a higher than
average "at-risk student population", as such term shall be defined by
the department of elementary and secondary education, for two years
for every one year the recipient received the urban flight and rural
needs scholarship;

30 (4) Has graduated from high school with a cumulative grade 31 point average of at least two and one-half on a four-point scale or 32 equivalent;

33 (5) Maintains a cumulative grade point average of at least two
34 and one-half on a four-point scale or equivalent.

4. If the number of applicants exceeds the number of
scholarships or revenues available, the department of elementary and
secondary education may consider the financial needs of the applicant.
5. The scholarships provided in this section shall be available to
otherwise eligible students who either:

40 (1) Are currently enrolled in a community college and make a 41 commitment to pursue a teacher education program approved by the 42 department of elementary and secondary education and offered by a 43 four-year college or university located in Missouri; or

44 (2) Have completed their baccalaureate degree and agree to
45 enter a teacher education program and make a commitment to pursue
46 a teacher education program approved by the department of
47 elementary and secondary education and offered by a four-year college
48 or university located in Missouri.

49 6. Every eligible student receiving scholarships under this 50section shall teach in an elementary or secondary public school in 51Missouri as provided in subdivision (3) of subsection 3 of this section. The student shall teach for a period of two years for every one 52year he or she received an urban flight and rural needs scholarship; 53otherwise, the scholarship shall be treated as a loan to the eligible 54student, and interest at the rate of nine and one-half percent per year 55shall be charged on the unpaid balance of the amount received from the 56

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57date the eligible student ceases to teach until the amount received is paid back to the state. In order to provide for the servicing of such 58loans, the department of elementary and secondary education may sell 59such loans to the higher education loan authority of the state of 60 Missouri created pursuant to sections 173.350 to 173.445. For each year 61 the student teaches, up to eight years, one-eighth of the amount 62 received pursuant to this section shall be applied against the total 63 amount received and shall not be subject to the repayment requirement 64 of this section; provided that twenty-five percent of such amount, not 65 66 subject to repayment, shall be repaid by the local school district to the 67 department. The department of elementary and secondary education 68 shall have the power to and shall defer interest and principal payments under certain circumstances, which shall include, but need not be 69 limited to, the enrollment in a graduate program or service in any 7071branch of the armed forces of the United States.

727. There is hereby established in the state treasury a fund to be known as the "Urban Flight and Rural Needs Scholarship Program 73 74Fund", which shall consist of all moneys that may be appropriated to it by the general assembly, and in addition may include any gifts, 7576 contributions, grants, or bequests received from federal, state, private, or other sources. The fund shall be administered by the department of 77elementary and secondary education. Notwithstanding the provisions 78of section 33.080, RSMo, to the contrary, moneys in the fund shall not 79 be transferred to the credit of the general revenue fund at the end of 80 81 the biennium. Interest and moneys earned on the fund shall be 82credited to the fund. Moneys in the fund shall be used solely for the purpose of awarding scholarships under the provisions of this section. 83

335.212. As used in sections 335.212 to 335.242, the following terms 2 mean:

3 4 (1) "Board", the Missouri state board of nursing;

(2) "Department", the Missouri department of health and senior services;

5 (3) "Director", director of the Missouri department of health and senior
6 services;

7 (4) "Eligible student", a resident who has [made application to be] been 8 accepted as a full-time student in a formal course of instruction leading to an 9 associate degree, a diploma, a bachelor of science, or a master of science in 10 nursing or leading to the completion of educational requirements for a licensed 11 practical nurse; 12 (5) "Participating school", an institution within this state which is 13 approved by the board for participation in the professional and practical nursing 14 student loan program established by sections 335.212 to 335.242, having a 15 nursing department and offering a course of instruction based on nursing theory 16 and clinical nursing experience;

17 (6) "Qualified applicant", an eligible student approved by the board for
18 participation in the professional and practical nursing student loan program
19 established by sections 335.212 to 335.242;

20(7) "Qualified employment", employment on a full-time basis in Missouri in a position requiring licensure as a licensed practical nurse or registered 21professional nurse in any hospital as defined in section 197.020, RSMo, or public 2223or nonprofit agency, institution, or organization located in an area of need as determined by the department of health and senior services. Any forgiveness of 2425such principal and interest for any qualified applicant engaged in qualified 26employment on a less than full-time basis may be prorated to reflect the amounts 27provided in this section;

(8) "Resident", any person who has lived in this state for one or more
years for any purpose other than the attending of an educational institution
located within this state.

335.233. The department shall establish schedules for repayment of the principal and interest on any financial assistance made under the provisions of sections 335.212 to 335.242. Interest at the rate of nine and one-half percent per annum shall be charged on all financial assistance made under the provisions of sections 335.212 to 335.242, but [twenty-five percent of] the interest and principal of the total financial assistance granted to a qualified applicant at the time of the successful completion of a nursing degree, diploma program or a practical nursing program shall be forgiven [for each year of] through qualified employment.

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
