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To repeal section 414.420, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the Missouri alternative fuels commission.

AN ACT

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 414.420, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 414.420, to read as follows:

414.420. 1. As used in this section, the term "alternative fuel" shall have the same meaning as in section 414.400.

2. There is hereby created the "Missouri [Ethanol and Other Renewable 3 Fuel Sources] Alternative Fuels Commission" composed of [seven] nine members, including two members of the senate of different political parties appointed by the president pro tem of the senate, two members of the house of representatives of different political parties appointed by the speaker of the house, and [three] five other persons appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate. The members appointed by the governor [may include, but are not limited to,] shall be persons engaged in [the ethanol production 11 industry] industries that produce and sell at retail and wholesale alternative fuels and no more than [two] three of such members shall be of the 1213 same political party. The members appointed by the governor shall be appointed for a term of four years, except that of the first members appointed, one shall 14 serve for a term of two years, one shall serve for a term of three years, and one 15 16 shall serve for a term of four years]. Vacancies in the membership of the commission shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. The 17

commission shall elect a member of its own group as chairman at the first

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meeting, which shall be called by the governor. The commission shall meet at 20 least four times in a calendar year at the call of the chairman. [The commission shall promote the continued production of ethanol and the continued usage of 2122ethanol and fuel ethanol blends, as defined in section 142.027, RSMo, and the production and usage of other renewable fuel sources, in this state. The 2324commission shall report to each regular session of the general assembly its recommendations for legislation in the field of the promotion of the ethanol 2526 industry and related subjects in this state.] Members of the commission shall 27 serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. 28

- 3. The commission shall:
- 30 (1) Make recommendations to the governor and general assembly 31 on changes to state law to facilitate the sale and distribution of 32 alternative fuels and alternative fuel vehicles;
- 33 (2) Promote the development, sale, distribution, and consumption 34 of alternative fuels;
- 35 (3) Promote the development and use of alternative fuel vehicles 36 and technology that will enhance the use of alternative and renewable 37 transportation fuels;
 - (4) Educate consumers about alternative fuels, including but not limited to ethanol and biodiesel;
- 40 (5) Develop a long-range plan for the state to reduce 41 consumption of petroleum fuels; and
- 42 (6) Submit an annual report to the governor and the general 43 assembly.
