AN ACT

To repeal section 414.420, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the Missouri alternative fuels commission.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 414.420, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 414.420, to read as follows:

414.420. 1. As used in this section, the term "alternative fuel" 2 shall have the same meaning as in section 414.400.

3 2. There is hereby created the "Missouri [Ethanol and Other Renewable Fuel Sources] Alternative Fuels Commission" composed of [seven] nine 4 members, including two members of the senate of different political parties 5 6 appointed by the president pro tem of the senate, two members of the house of representatives of different political parties appointed by the speaker of the 7 house, and [three] five other persons appointed by the governor, with the advice 8 9 and consent of the senate. The members appointed by the governor [may include, 10but are not limited to,] shall be persons engaged in [the ethanol production industry] industries that produce alternative fuels and no more than [two] 11 12three of such members shall be of the same political party. The members appointed by the governor shall be appointed for a term of four years, except that 1314of the first members appointed, one shall serve for a term of two years, one shall serve for a term of three years, and one shall serve for a term of four 15years]. Vacancies in the membership of the commission shall be filled in the 16 same manner as the original appointments. The commission shall elect a member 1718 of its own group as chairman at the first meeting, which shall be called by the 19governor. The commission shall meet at least four times in a calendar year at the

call of the chairman. [The commission shall promote the continued production 2021of ethanol and the continued usage of ethanol and fuel ethanol blends, as defined in section 142.027, RSMo, and the production and usage of other renewable fuel 2223sources, in this state. The commission shall report to each regular session of the general assembly its recommendations for legislation in the field of the promotion 2425of the ethanol industry and related subjects in this state.] Members of the commission shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for actual 26and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. 27

28 **3. The commission shall:**

(1) Make recommendations to the governor and general assembly
on changes to state law to facilitate the sale and distribution of
alternative fuels and alternative fuel vehicles;

32 (2) Promote the development, sale, distribution, and consumption
 33 of alternative fuels;

34 (3) Promote the development and use of alternative fuel vehicles
35 and technology that will enhance the use of alternative and renewable
36 transportation fuels;

37 (4) Educate consumers about alternative fuels, including but not
38 limited to ethanol and biodiesel;

39 (5) Develop a long-range plan for the state to reduce
40 consumption of petroleum fuels; and

41 (6) Submit an annual report to the governor and the general42 assembly.
