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AN ACT

To amend chapter 265, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to rice seed, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 265, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 265.525, to read as follows:

265.525. 1. This section shall be known as the "Missouri Rice 2 Certification Act".

3 2. As used in this section, the following terms shall mean:

4 (1) "Characteristics of commercial impact", characteristics that 5 may adversely affect the marketability of rice in the event of 6 commingling with other rice and may include, but are not limited to, 7 those characteristics that cannot be visually identified without the aid 8 of specialized equipment or testing, those characteristics that create a 9 significant economic impact in their removal from commingled rice, 10 and those characteristics whose removal from commingled rice is 11 infeasible;

12 (2) "Committee", the rice certification committee established in13 this section;

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(3) "Department", the department of agriculture;

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(4) "Director", the director of the department of agriculture;

(6) "Handler", any person engaged in this state in the business of
marketing rice, including persons engaged in the drying, milling, or
storing of rice;

21 (7) "Person", any individual, partnership, limited liability

SB 387 $\mathbf{2}$ 22company, limited liability partnership, corporation, firm, company, or 23any other entity doing business in Missouri; 24(8) "Producer", any person who produces, or causes to be produced, rice; 2526(9) "Rice", all rough or "paddy" rice or brown rice (Oryza species) 27produced in or shipped in Missouri, including rice produced for seed.It does not include wild rice (Zinzania aquatic or Zinzania palustris). 28293. Except as provided by rules promulgated by the department, 30 it shall be unlawful for any person to introduce, sell, plant, produce, harvest, transport, store, process, or otherwise handle rice identified 31as having characteristics of commercial impact. 32334. There is hereby created within the department of agriculture the "Rice Certification Committee". The committee shall be made up of 34the following nine members: 3536 (1) The director, or his or her designee; 37 (2) Two members appointed by the director to include: (a) An individual representing handlers in Missouri; 38 39 (b) An individual representing end users; 40(3) Six members appointed by the director as recommended by 41the Missouri Rice Research and Merchandising Council to include: 42(a) Two producers, neither of whom shall be employed by or serve on the board of any rice mill or rice merchandiser; 43

44 (b) Two scientists employed by institutes of higher education in45 Missouri;

46 (c) A representative of rice mills operating in Missouri; and

47 (d) A representative of rice seed dealers.

485. Members of the committee shall serve terms of three years in length except that the director shall be a permanent member of the 49committee and the director shall stagger the terms of the initial 50appointments so that three members serve terms of two years, three 51members serve terms of three years, and two members serve terms of 52four years. There is no limit to the number of terms a member may 53serve. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner of representation 54as the original appointments. 55

56 6. The rice certification committee shall meet no less than twice 57 annually as determined by the chairperson of the committee, who shall 58 be elected by the committee at its first meeting and once every 59 calendar year thereafter. Members of the committee shall serve 60 without compensation but shall be reimbursed for their actual and 61 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties.

62 7. The powers and duties of the rice certification committee shall
63 include, but not be limited to, all of the following:

64 (1) Identifying rice varieties that have characteristics of65 commercial impact;

66 (2) Developing rules that shall be promulgated by the 67 department regarding the selling, planting, producing, harvesting, 68 transporting, drying, storing, processing, testing, or other handling of 69 rice identified as having characteristics of commercial impact;

(3) Reviewing the efficacy of terms and conditions of identity
preservation programs imposed on the planting, producing, harvesting,
transporting, drying, storing, testing, or otherwise handling of rice
identified using the most current industry standards and generally
accepted scientific principles;

(4) Reviewing each rice variety identified as having
characteristics of commercial impact not less often than every two
years, or upon receipt of a petition from the purveyor of the rice;

(5) Making recommendations to the director on all matters
pertaining to this section, including, but not limited to, enforcement of
this section;

(6) Reviewing and approving any and all rules, policies, and procedures proposed by the department to implement this section provided that the committee shall render a decision within sixty days of the receipt of any proposed rule, policy, or procedure from the department or else the department may proceed without the committee's approval;

(7) Holding hearings to review appeals of notices of violation
issued by the department and voting to uphold or not uphold the
alleged violation. A hearing must be held within sixty days of receipt
of the request for a hearing or else the notice of violation stands as
issued by the department.

8. Neither the recommendations of the committee nor any rule
promulgated under this section shall be construed as establishing any
production, processing, or market tolerance.

9. The department shall have the power to:

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96 (1) Maintain the integrity and prevent the contamination of rice
97 which has not been identified as having characteristics of commercial
98 impact;

99 (2) Prevent the introduction of disease, weeds, or other pests
100 that would adversely affect rice which has not been identified as
101 having characteristics of commercial impact;

102(3) Require that persons selling, offering for sale, or otherwise 103 distributing seed for the production of rice identified as having 104 characteristics of commercial impact, or that persons bringing rice identified as having characteristics of commercial impact into the state 105for processing, notify the department of the location of planting sites 106and the dates and procedures for planting, producing, harvesting, 107 transporting, drying, storing, testing, or otherwise handling of rice 108identified as having characteristics of commercial impact; 109

(4) Require that persons receiving rice having been identified as having characteristics of commercial impact produced outside the state for processing notify the department of the location of the receipt and the procedures for processing, transporting, drying, storing, testing, or otherwise handling the rice to prevent commercial impact to other rice and the spread of weeds, disease, or other pests;

(5) Enforce restrictions and prohibitions imposed by the
department on the selling, planting, producing, harvesting,
transporting, drying, storing, testing, processing, or otherwise handling
of rice identified as having characteristics of commercial impact;

(6) Investigate alleged violations of this section, issue notices of
violation, provide for an appeals process for persons aggrieved by the
provisions of this section, and impose penalties for violation of this
section;

(7) Encourage research and development of new types of rice.
125 10. The penalty for violating a provision of this section shall be
126 no less than ten thousand dollars nor more than one hundred thousand

dollars per day per violation.
11. The department shall promulgate rules to implement the
provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is
defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority
delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with
and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if

applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo,
are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general
assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the
effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held
unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule
proposed or adopted after August 28, 2007, shall be invalid and void.

139 12. If the department determines a person has violated any 140provision of this section, the department shall provide written notice 141to such person informing the person of the violation. The notice shall 142inform the person of the right to request a hearing before the rice certification committee as established in this section. If a hearing is 143held and a majority of the committee agree that a violation occurred, 144the department shall impose a penalty as authorized in subsection 8 of 145this section. Nothing in this section shall prevent a person from 146seeking judicial relief. 147

148 13. The provisions of this section shall become effective one
149 hundred eighty days from the effective date of this act.
