### AN ACT

To repeal section 221.040, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to the responsibility of receiving prisoners, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 221.040, RSMo, is repealed and one new section 2 enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 221.040, to read as follows:

221.040. 1. It shall be the duty of the sheriff and jailer to receive, from constables and other officers, all persons, except as provided in subsection **2 of this section**, who shall be apprehended by such constable or other officers, for offenses against this state, or who shall be committed to such jail by any competent authority; and if any sheriff or jailer shall refuse to receive any such person or persons, he shall be adjudged guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction shall be fined in the discretion of the court.

8 2. The sheriff and jailer are not required to receive or detain a 9 prisoner in custody under subsection 1 of this section until the 10 arresting constable or other officer has had the prisoner examined by 11 a physician or competent medical personnel if the prisoner appears to 12 be:

- 13 (1) Unconscious;
- 14
- *i) chechisere*
- 4 (2) Suffering from a serious illness;
- 15 (3) Suffering from a serious injury; or

16 (4) Seriously impaired by alcohol, a controlled substance as 17 defined in section 195.017, RSMo, a drug other than a controlled 18 substance, or a combination of alcohol, a controlled substance, or 19 drugs.

- 3. The cost of examination and resulting treatment under
