Families will find admission to the State Fair is always very affordable, and parking is free. Children 12 and under are free every day. On opening day, adult admission is \$1, and on the second Thursday is \$2. A regular daily adult admission ticket is \$8, with senior admission at \$6.

A trip to the State Fair can create some great family memories, and I hope many of you will take advantage of this wonderful summertime event, which was recently named one of Missouri's best family destinations.
