## AN ACT

To repeal sections 169.020, 169.040, 169.056, 169.070, 169.073, 169.075, 169.090, 169.130, 169.630, 169.650, 169.655, 169.670, and 169.690, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof fifteen new sections relating to public employee retirement systems.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 169.020, 169.040, 169.056, 169.070, 169.073, 169.075,

- 2 169.090, 169.130, 169.630, 169.650, 169.655, 169.670, and 169.690, RSMo, are
- 3 repealed and fifteen new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections
- 4 100.273, 169.020, 169.040, 169.056, 169.070, 169.073, 169.075, 169.090, 169.130,
- 5 169.630, 169.650, 169.655, 169.670, 169.690, and 169.750, to read as follows:

100.273. 1. Any employee of the Missouri development finance

- 2 board who is employed on or after August 28, 2009, and is in a benefit-
- 3 eligible position as set forth under the definition of an "employee"
- 4 pursuant to section 104.1003, RSMo, shall be both a state employee and
- 5 a member of the Missouri state employees' retirement system under the
- 6 year 2000 plan.
- 7 2. Employees described in subsection 1 of this section may elect
- 8 to purchase credited service for any period of employment as an
- 9 employee of the board prior to August 28, 2009, if such service would
- 10 have otherwise been benefit-eligible service as set forth under the
- 11 definition of an "employee" pursuant to section 104.1003, RSMo. Such
- 12 purchase shall be effected by the employee's election to transfer to the

system, not later than December 31, 2009, the employee's individual account balance under the board-sponsored retirement plan that is attributable to contributions made by the board and the employee 15 during the period of the employee's employment with the board, 16 17including earnings thereon; provided, however, that such amount shall not exceed the amount necessary to fund the benefit attributable to 18 such service credit, in which case the excess shall be refunded by the 19 system to the board-sponsored plan. The board shall certify to the 20 system that any amount so transferred is attributable to such 21contributions by the board for such employee, plus earnings 22 23 thereon. The system shall be immune from suit and shall not be subject to any liability arising out of or associated with the proper source or 2425 nature of the amount so transferred. Upon receipt of an employee's contribution, the system shall determine any additional contributions 26 27 necessary to pay for the balance of the employee's credited service and notify the board of any additional contributions necessary to complete 2829 the purchase. The board shall promptly pay such contributions, if any, to the system. In the event an employee who purchased credited 30 service under this subsection terminates employment before becoming 31 32eligible for an annuity or deferred annuity, the system shall refund to the employee his or her contribution, with interest credited thereon at 33 the current actuarial assumed rate of return. 34

benefits for public school teachers, there is hereby created and established a retirement system which shall be a body corporate, shall be under the management of a board of trustees herein described, and shall be known as "The Public School Retirement System of Missouri". Such system shall, by and in such name, sue and be sued, transact all of its business, invest all of its funds, and hold all of its cash, securities, and other property. The system so created shall include all school districts in this state, except those in cities that had populations of four hundred thousand or more according to the latest United States decennial census, and such others as are or hereafter may be included in a similar system or in similar systems established by law and made operative; provided, that teachers in school districts of more than four hundred thousand inhabitants who are or may become members of a local retirement system may

become members of this system with the same legal benefits as accrue to present 14 members of such state system on the terms and under the conditions provided for 15

in section 169.021. The system hereby established shall begin operations on the 16

17 first day of July next following the date upon which sections 169.010 to 169.130

- 2. The general administration and the responsibility for the proper operation of the retirement system and for making effective the provisions of sections 169.010 to 169.141 are hereby vested in a board of trustees of seven persons as follows: four persons to be elected as trustees by the members and retired members of the public school retirement system created by sections 169.010 to 169.141 and the public education employee retirement system created by sections 169.600 to 169.715; and three members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate. The first member appointed by the governor shall replace the commissioner of education for a term beginning August 28, 1998. The other two members shall be appointed by the governor at the time each member's, who was appointed by the state board of education, term expires.
- 3. Trustees appointed and elected shall be chosen for terms of four years from the first day of July next following their appointment or election, except that 32one of the elected trustees shall be a member of the public education employee 33 retirement system and shall be initially elected for a term of three years from July 1, 1991. The initial term of one other elected trustee shall commence on July 1, 1992.
- 36 4. Trustees appointed by the governor shall be residents of school districts 37 included in the retirement system, but not employees of such districts or a state employee or a state elected official. At least one trustee so appointed shall be a 38 retired member of the public school retirement system or the public education 39 employee retirement system. Three elected trustees shall be members of the 40 41 public school retirement system and one elected trustee shall be a member of the public education employee retirement system. 42
- 43 5. The elections of the trustees shall be arranged for, managed and 44 conducted by the board of trustees of the retirement system.
- 45 6. If a vacancy occurs in the office of trustee, the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as the office was previously filled. 46
- 47 7. Trustees of the retirement system shall serve without compensation but they shall be reimbursed for expenses necessarily incurred through service on the 48

49 board of trustees.

- 8. Each trustee shall be commissioned by the governor, and before entering upon the duties of the trustee's office, shall take and subscribe to an oath or affirmation to support the Constitution of the United States, and of the state of Missouri and to demean himself or herself faithfully in the trustee's office. Such oath as subscribed to shall be filed in the office of secretary of state of this state.
- 56 9. Each trustee shall be entitled to one vote in the board of trustees. Four votes shall be necessary for a decision by the trustees at any meeting of the board 57 of trustees. Unless otherwise expressly provided herein, a meeting need not be 58 59 called or held to make any decision on a matter before the board. Each member 60 must be sent by the executive director a copy of the matter to be decided with full information from the files of the board of trustees. The unanimous decision of 61 four trustees may decide the issue by signing a document declaring their decision 62and sending such written instrument to the executive director of the board, 63 64 provided that no other member of the board of trustees shall send a dissenting decision to the executive director of the board within fifteen days after such 65 document and information was mailed to the trustee. If any member is not in 66 67 agreement with four members the matter is to be passed on at a regular board 68 meeting or a special meeting called for the purpose.
  - 10. The board of trustees shall elect one of their number as chairman, and shall employ a full-time executive director, not one of their number, who shall be the executive officer of the board. Other employees of the board shall be chosen only upon the recommendation of the executive director.
- 11. The board of trustees shall employ an actuary who shall be its technical advisor on matters regarding the operation of the retirement system, and shall perform such duties as are essential in connection therewith, including the recommendation for adoption by the board of mortality and other necessary tables, and the recommendation of the level rate of contributions required for operation of the system.
- 12. As soon as practicable after the establishment of the retirement system, and annually thereafter, the actuary shall make a valuation of the system's assets and liabilities on the basis of such tables as have been adopted.
- 13. At least once in the three-year period following the establishment of the retirement system, and in each five-year period thereafter, the board of

trustees shall cause to be made an actuarial investigation into the mortality, service, and compensation experience of the members and beneficiaries of the system, and shall make any changes in the mortality, service, and other tables then in use which the results of the investigation show to be necessary.

- 14. Subject to the limitations of sections 169.010 to 169.141 and 169.600 to 169.715, the board of trustees shall formulate and adopt rules and regulations for the government of its own proceedings and for the administration of the retirement system.
- 92 15. The board of trustees shall determine and decide all questions of doubt as to what constitutes employment within the meaning of sections 169.010 93 to 169.141 and 169.600 to 169.715, the amount of benefits to be paid to members, 94 95 retired members, beneficiaries and survivors and the amount of contributions to be paid by employer and employee. The executive director shall notify by 96 certified mail both employer and member, retired member, beneficiary or survivor 97 interested in such determination. Any member, retired member, beneficiary or 98 99 survivor, district or employer adversely affected by such determination, at any 100 time within thirty days after being notified of such determination, may appeal to the circuit court of Cole County. Such appeal shall be tried and determined anew 101 102 in the circuit court and such court shall hear and consider any and all competent 103 testimony relative to the issues in the case, which may be offered by either party 104 thereto. The circuit court shall determine the rights of the parties under sections 169.010 to 169.141 and 169.600 to 169.715 using the same standard provided in 105 106 section 536.150, RSMo, and the judgment or order of such circuit court shall be 107 binding upon the parties and the board shall carry out such judgment or order unless an appeal is taken from such decision of the circuit court. Appeals may 108 109 be had from the circuit court by the employer, member, retired member, beneficiary, survivor or the board, in the manner provided by the civil code. 110
  - 16. The board of trustees shall keep a record of all its proceedings, which shall be open to public inspection. It shall prepare annually a comprehensive annual financial report, the financial section of which shall be prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and shall include the independent auditor's opinion letter. The report shall also include information on the actuarial status and the investments of the system. The reports shall be preserved by the executive director and made available for public inspection.
- 118 17. The board of trustees shall provide for the maintenance of an

individual account with each member, setting forth such data as may be 119 necessary for a ready determination of the member's earnings, contributions, and 120 interest accumulations. It shall also collect and keep in convenient form such 121122 data as shall be necessary for the preparation of the required mortality and 123 service tables and for the compilation of such other information as shall be 124required for the valuation of the system's assets and liabilities. All individually 125 identifiable information pertaining to members, retirees, beneficiaries and 126 survivors shall be confidential.

18. The board of trustees shall meet regularly at least twice each year, with the dates of such meetings to be designated in the rules and regulations adopted by the board. Such other meetings as are deemed necessary may be called by the chairman of the board or by any four members acting jointly.

- 19. The headquarters of the retirement system shall be in Jefferson City, where suitable office space, utilities and other services and equipment necessary for the operation of the system shall be provided by the board of trustees and all costs shall be paid from funds of the system. All suits [in which] or proceedings directly or indirectly against the board of trustees, the board's members or employees or the retirement system established by sections 169.010 to 169.141 or 169.600 to 169.715 [are parties] shall be brought in Cole County.
- 20. The board may appoint an attorney or firm of attorneys to be the legal advisor to the board and to represent the board in legal proceedings, however, if the board does not make such an appointment, the attorney general shall be the legal advisor of the board of trustees, and shall represent the board in all legal proceedings.
- 143 21. The board of trustees shall arrange for adequate surety bonds covering 144 the executive director. When approved by the board, such bonds shall be 145 deposited in the office of the secretary of state of this state.
- 146 22. The board shall arrange for annual audits of the records and accounts 147 of the system by a firm of certified public accountants, the state auditor shall 148 review the audit of the records and accounts of the system at least once every 149 three years and shall report the results to the board of trustees and the governor.
- 150 23. The board by its rules may establish an interest charge to be paid by 151 the employer on any payments of contributions which are delinquent. The rate 152 charged shall not exceed the actuarially assumed rate of return on invested funds 153 of the pertinent system.

169.040. 1. All funds arising from the operation of sections 169.010 to 169.141 shall belong to the retirement system herein created and shall be controlled by the board of trustees of that system which board shall provide for the collection of such funds, shall see that they are safely preserved, and shall permit their disbursement only for the purposes herein authorized. Such funds and all other funds received by the retirement system are declared and shall be deemed to be the moneys and funds of the retirement system and not revenue collected or moneys received by the state and shall not be commingled with state funds.

10 2. The board shall invest all funds under its control which are in excess of a safe operating balance. The funds shall be invested only in those 11 12investments which a prudent person acting in a like capacity and familiar with these matters would use in the conduct of an enterprise of a like character and 13 with like aims, as provided in section 105.688, RSMo. The board of trustees may 14 delegate to duly appointed investment counselors authority to act in place of the 15 16 board in the investment and reinvestment of all or part of the moneys of the 17 system, and may also delegate to such counselors the authority to act in place of the board in the holding, purchasing, selling, assigning, transferring or disposing 18 19 of any or all of the securities and investments in which such moneys shall have 20 been invested, as well as the proceeds of such investments and such moneys. Such investment counselors shall be registered as investment advisors 21with the United States Securities and Exchange Commission. In exercising or 2223delegating its investment powers and authority, members of the board shall 24 exercise ordinary business care and prudence under the facts and circumstances prevailing at the time of the action or decision. No member of the board shall be 25liable for any action taken or omitted with respect to the exercise of, or delegation 26 of, these powers and authority if such member shall have discharged the duties 2728 of his or her position in good faith and with that degree of diligence, care and skill which a prudent person acting in a like capacity and familiar with these 29 30 matters would use in the conduct of an enterprise of a like character and with 31 like aims.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 105.662, RSMo, the board may set up and maintain a public school and education employee retirement systems of Missouri investment fund account in which investment and reinvestment of all or part of the moneys of the system

may be placed and be available for investment purposes. For the 36 37 purpose of investing the funds of the retirement system, the funds may be combined with the funds of the public education employee 38 retirement system of Missouri, but the funds of each system shall be 39 40 accounted for separately and for all other reporting purposes shall be separate. The board of trustees may promulgate such rules and 41 regulations consistent with the provisions of section 169.040 as deemed 42 43 necessary for its proper administration, pursuant to the provisions of this section and this chapter. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that 44 term is defined in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the 4546 authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, 47 48 RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested 49 50 with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are 51 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking 52authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2009, shall 53be invalid and void. 54

4. No investment transaction authorized by the board shall be handled by any company or firm in which a member of the board has an interest, nor shall any member of the board profit directly or indirectly from any such investment. All investments shall be made for the account of the retirement system, and any securities or other properties obtained by the board of trustees may be held by a custodian in the name of the retirement system, or in the name of a nominee in order to facilitate the expeditious transfer of such securities or other property. Such securities or other properties which are not available in registered form may be held in bearer form or in book entry form. The retirement system is further authorized to deposit, or have deposited for its account, eligible securities in a central depository system or clearing corporation or in a federal reserve bank under a book entry system as defined in the Uniform Commercial Code, sections 400.8-102 and 400.8-109, RSMo. When such eligible securities of the retirement system are so deposited with a central depository system they may be merged and held in the name of the nominee of such securities depository and title to such securities may be transferred by bookkeeping entry on the books of

such securities depository or federal reserve bank without physical delivery of the certificates or documents representing such securities.

- [4.] 5. With appropriate safeguards against loss by the system in any contingency, the board may designate a bank or trust company to serve as a depository of system funds and intermediary in the investment of those funds and payment of system obligations.
- 77 [5.] 6. All retirement allowances or other periodic payments paid by the 78 board shall be paid to recipients of such payments by electronic funds transfer, 79 unless another method has been determined by the board to be appropriate. Each recipient of retirement allowances or other periodic payments shall designate a 80 financial institution or other authorized payment agent and provide the board 81 82 information necessary for the recipient to receive electronic funds transfer payments through the institution or agent designated. This subsection shall 83 apply to retirement allowances and other periodic payments first paid on or after 84 January 1, 1998, and shall apply to all retirement allowances and other periodic 85 86 payments on and after January 1, 1999.
- 87 [6.] 7. The board of trustees may deliberate about, or make tentative or final decisions on, investments or other financial matters in a closed meeting 88 89 under chapter 610, RSMo, if disclosure of the deliberations or decisions would 90 jeopardize the ability to implement a decision or to achieve investment objectives. A record of the retirement system that discloses deliberations about, or a 91 tentative decision on, investments or other financial matters is not a public record 92 93 under chapter 610, RSMo, to the extent and so long as its disclosure would 94 jeopardize the ability to implement a decision or to achieve investment objectives.
- 169.056. 1. Members who have accrued at least one year of membership service credit for employment in a position covered by this retirement system and who have covered employment with this retirement system following the service for which credit is being purchased may purchase membership service credit under the circumstances, terms and conditions provided in this section. With respect to each such purchase authorized by this section the following provisions apply:
- 8 (1) The purchase shall be effected by the member paying to the retirement 9 system the amount the member would have contributed and the amount the 10 employer would have contributed had such member been an employee for the 11 number of years for which the member is electing to purchase credit, and had the

member's compensation during such period been the highest annual salary rate on record with the retirement system on the date of election to purchase 13 credit. For purposes of this section, "annual salary rate" means the annual salary 1415 rate for full-time service for the position of employment. The contribution rate 16 used in determining the amount to be paid shall be the contribution rate in effect 17on the date of election to purchase credit. Notwithstanding the provisions of this subsection, for all elections to purchase credit received by the retirement system 18 19 on or after January 1, 2006, the member shall receive credit based on the amount 20 paid by the member for such credit and received by the retirement system by the close of business on June thirtieth of each year. In lieu of charging the member 21interest on such purchase of credit, the amount to be paid by the member for any 2223remaining credit the member has elected to purchase but has not paid for by [June] September thirtieth of each year shall be recalculated on the following 24[July] October first using the contribution rate in effect on that July first and 25the highest salary of record for the member as of that July first. For all elections 2627to purchase credit received by the retirement system prior to January 1, 2006, the 28retirement system shall determine the cost of such purchase using the calculation method in effect for elections to purchase credit received by the retirement system 29 30 on or after January 1, 2006, provided that the member shall have a one-time, 31 irrevocable option to continue to have the cost of such purchase be determined 32using the calculation method in effect at the time of such election to purchase 33 such credit. To be effective, such option must be elected by the member on a form approved by the retirement system and such form must be received by the 3435 retirement system by the close of business on June 30, 2006. The retirement system [reserves the right to] may prohibit a purchase, impose additional 36 requirements for making a purchase, or limit the amount of credit 37purchased [by the member in any year if the amounts paid by the member in that 38 39 year would exceed any applicable contribution limits set forth in] if necessary for the retirement system to comply with federal law, including but not 40limited to, the provisions of Section 415 of Title 26 of the United States 41 42Code. The board of trustees may promulgate such rules and regulations consistent with the provisions of section 169.056 as deemed necessary 4344 for its proper administration, pursuant to the provisions of this section and this chapter. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined 45 in section 536.010, RSMo, that is created under the authority delegated

in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is 47 48 subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, RSMo, and, if applicable, section 536.028, RSMo. This section and chapter 536, RSMo, are 49 nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly 50 pursuant to chapter 536, RSMo, to review, to delay the effective date, 51disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held 5253 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2009, shall be invalid and void; 54

- (2) Membership service credit purchased pursuant to this section shall be deemed to be membership service in Missouri for purposes of subsection [7] 8 of section 169.070;
- (3) An election to purchase membership service credit pursuant to this section and payment for the purchase shall be completed prior to termination of membership with the retirement system with interest on the unpaid balance;
- (4) Members may purchase membership service credit in increments of one-tenth of a year, and multiple elections to purchase may be made;
- (5) Additional terms and conditions applicable to purchase made pursuant to this section including, but not limited to, minimum payments, payment schedules and provisions applicable when a member fails to complete payment may be set by rules of the board.
- 2. Membership service credit shall not be allowed pursuant to this section or sections 169.570 and 169.577 which exceeds in length the member's membership service credit for employment in a position covered by this system, and in no event may the member receive membership service credit with both this system and another public retirement system for the same service.
- 3. A member who was employed for at least twenty hours per week on a regular basis by a public school district, public community college, public college, or public university, either inside or outside of this state, may elect to purchase equivalent membership service credit.
- 4. A member who has served in the armed forces of the United States of
  America and who was discharged or separated from the armed forces by other
  than a dishonorable discharge may elect to purchase membership service for the
  period of active duty service in the armed forces.
- 5. Any member granted unpaid maternity or paternity leave for a period, from a position covered by the retirement system, who returned to employment

82 in such a position, may elect to purchase membership service credit for the period 83 of leave.

- 6. Any member who is or was certified as a vocational-technical teacher on the basis of having a college degree or who was required to have a period of work experience of at least two years in the area of the subject being taught in order to qualify for such certification may, upon written application to the board, purchase equivalent membership service credit for such work experience which shall not exceed the two years necessary for certification if the work experience was in the area that the member taught or is teaching and was completed in two years.
- 7. Any member who had membership service credit with the public education employee retirement system of Missouri governed by sections 169.600 to 169.715 but which membership service credit was forfeited by withdrawal or refund may elect to purchase credit for such service. The public education employee retirement system of Missouri shall transfer to this system an amount equal to the employer contributions for the forfeited service being purchased, plus interest, which shall be applied to reduce the amount the member would otherwise pay for the purchase, provided that the amount transferred shall not exceed one-half of the purchase cost.
- 8. A member may elect to purchase membership service credit for service rendered while on leave from an employer, as defined in section 169.010, for a not-for-profit corporation or agency whose primary purpose is support of education or education research, if the member was employed by that organization to serve twenty or more hours per week on a regular basis.
- 9. A member who was employed by a private school, private community college, private college, or private university, either inside or outside of this state, for at least twenty hours per week on a regular basis, may elect to purchase equivalent membership service credit for such service rendered.
- 10. A member who was employed in nonfederal public employment for at least twenty hours a week on a regular basis shall be permitted to purchase equivalent creditable service in the retirement system for such employment subject to provisions of this section.
- 11. A member who, while eighteen years of age or older, was employed in 115 a position covered by Social Security for at least twenty hours a week on a 116 regular basis shall be permitted to purchase equivalent creditable service in the

117 retirement system for such employment subject to provisions of this section.

169.070. 1. The retirement allowance of a member whose age at retirement is sixty years or more and whose creditable service is five years or

- 3 more, or whose sum of age and creditable service equals eighty years or more, or
- 4 who has attained age fifty-five and whose creditable service is twenty-five years
- 5 or more or whose creditable service is thirty years or more regardless of age, may
- 6 be the sum of the following items, not to exceed one hundred percent of the
- 7 member's final average salary:
- 8 (1) Two and five-tenths percent of the member's final average salary for
- 9 each year of membership service;
- 10 (2) Six-tenths of the amount payable for a year of membership service for
- 11 each year of prior service not exceeding thirty years.
- 12 In lieu of the retirement allowance otherwise provided in subdivisions (1) and (2)
- 13 of this subsection, a member may elect to receive a retirement allowance of:
- 14 (3) Between July 1, 1998, and July 1, 2013, two and four-tenths percent
- 15 of the member's final average salary for each year of membership service, if the
- 16 member's creditable service is twenty-nine years or more but less than thirty
- 17 years, and the member has not attained age fifty-five;
- 18 (4) Between July 1, 1998, and July 1, 2013, two and
- 19 thirty-five-hundredths percent of the member's final average salary for each year
- 20 of membership service, if the member's creditable service is twenty-eight years
- 21 or more but less than twenty-nine years, and the member has not attained age
- 22 fifty-five;
- 23 (5) Between July 1, 1998, and July 1, 2013, two and three-tenths percent
- 24 of the member's final average salary for each year of membership service, if the
- 25 member's creditable service is twenty-seven years or more but less than
- 26 twenty-eight years, and the member has not attained age fifty-five;
- 27 (6) Between July 1, 1998, and July 1, 2013, two and
- 28 twenty-five-hundredths percent of the member's final average salary for each year
- 29 of membership service, if the member's creditable service is twenty-six years or
- 30 more but less than twenty-seven years, and the member has not attained age
- 31 fifty-five;
- 32 (7) Between July 1, 1998, and July 1, 2013, two and two-tenths percent
- 33 of the member's final average salary for each year of membership service, if the
- 34 member's creditable service is twenty-five years or more but less than twenty-six

Upon an election pursuant to subsection 1 of this section, a surviving spouse, if designated as the sole beneficiary, who has in the surviving spouse's care a dependent unmarried child, including a stepchild or adopted child, of the deceased member, under eighteen years of age, shall be entitled to a monthly payment equal to twenty percent of one-twelfth of the annual salary rate on which the member contributed for the member's last full year of creditable service as a teacher in a district included in the retirement system until the surviving spouse's death, or the first date when no such dependent unmarried child under age eighteen, or age twenty-four if the child is enrolled in school on a full-time basis, remains in the surviving spouse's care, whichever first occurs; provided that the monthly payment shall not be less than five hundred seventy-five dollars or more than eight hundred sixty dollars. In addition the surviving spouse shall be entitled to a monthly payment equal to one-half this amount, provided that the

Any person, duly certified under the law governing the certification of teachers, employed full time as a teacher by the section of inmate education of the department of corrections prior to August 13, 1986, who did not become a member of the Missouri state employees' retirement system under section 104.342, RSMo, is a member of the public school retirement system of Missouri. Any such person who becomes a member before the end of the school year next following August 29, 1959, may claim and receive credit for prior service. For purposes of this subsection "prior service" means service rendered by a member of the retirement system before the system becomes operative with respect to persons employed by the section of inmate education, and may include service rendered by a member of the armed forces during a period of war, if the member was a teacher at the time he was inducted, for which credit has been approved by the board of trustees.

4. Any person, duly certificated under the law governing the certification of teachers, employed full time by any statewide nonprofit educational association or organization serving on an educational professional basis through its membership the active members of the public school retirement system of Missouri or the public school districts maintaining high schools in this state, may be a member of the public school retirement system of Missouri. When such eligible securities of the retirement system are so deposited with a central depository system, the securities may be merged and held in the name of the nominee of such securities depository and title to such securities may be transferred by bookkeeping entry on the books of such securities depository or federal reserve bank without physical delivery of the certificates or documents representing such securities.

The board of trustees may reduce the amounts which have been granted as increases to a member pursuant to subsection 2 of this section if the cost of living, as determined by the board and as measured by generally accepted standards, is less than the cost of living was at the time of the first increase granted to the member; provided that, the reductions shall not exceed the amount of increases which have been made to the member's allowance after December 31, 1981.

Option 7. A plan of variable monthly benefit payments which provides, in conjunction with the member's retirement benefits under the federal Social Security laws, level or near-level retirement benefit payments to the member for life during retirement, and if authorized, to an appropriate beneficiary designated by the member. Such a plan shall be actuarially equivalent to the retirement allowance under option 1 and shall be available for election only if established by the board of trustees under duly adopted rules.

- (2) The election of an option may be made only in the application for retirement and such application must be filed prior to the date on which the retirement of the member is to be effective. If either the member or the person nominated dies before the effective date of retirement, the option shall not be effective, provided that:

If the total of the retirement or disability allowances paid to an individual before the person's death is less than the person's accumulated contributions at the time of the person's retirement, the difference shall be paid to the person's beneficiary or, if there is no beneficiary, to the [(1)] surviving spouse, [(2)] surviving children in equal shares, [(3)] surviving parents in equal shares, or [(4)] person's estate, in that order of precedence; provided, however, that if an optional benefit, as provided in option 2, 3 or 4 in subsection 4 of this section, had been elected and the beneficiary dies after receiving the optional benefit, then, if the total retirement allowances paid to the retired individual and 173the individual's beneficiary are less than the total of the contributions, the difference shall be paid to the [(1)] surviving spouse, [(2)] surviving children in equal shares, [(3)] surviving parents in equal shares, or [(4)] estate of the beneficiary, in that order of precedence, unless the retired individual designates a different recipient with the board at or after retirement.

Neither the funds belonging to the retirement system nor any benefit accrued or accruing to any person under the provisions of sections 169.600 to 169.710 shall be subject to execution, garnishment, attachment or any other process whatsoever, nor shall they be assignable, except in a proceeding instituted for spousal maintenance or child support and as in sections 169.600 to 169.710 specifically provided.

of trustees, the retirement systems established under sections 169.020 and 169.610 may indemnify and protect any trustee or employee of the retirement system against any or all claims or liabilities, including defense thereof, arising out of his or her responsibilities with respect to the retirement system provided, however, that no trustee or employee shall be indemnified for his or her own gross negligence or willful misconduct. This section shall apply whether the claim is made against the employee or trustee in his or her individual or official

- 2. The board of trustees is authorized to obtain and maintain insurance or indemnity policies to insure the trustees and employees of the retirement system against any liability or losses incurred as a result of their responsibilities with respect to the retirement system.
- 3. No employee or trustee shall be entitled to indemnification under this section unless within fifteen days after receipt of service of process he or she shall give written notice of such proceeding to the board of trustees.
