AN ACT

To amend chapter 324, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to professional registration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 324, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new 2 section, to be known as section 324.004, to read as follows:

324.004. 1. For the purposes of this section, the following terms

- 2 shall mean:
- 3 (1) "Licensing", any required training, education, or fee to work 4 in a specific profession;
- 5 (2) "Licensing authority", an agency, examining board, 6 credentialing board, or other office with the authority to impose 7 occupational fees or licensing requirements on any profession;
- 8 (3) "Low-income individuals", individuals whose household 9 adjusted gross income is below one hundred thirty percent of the
- 10 federal poverty line, or a higher threshold to be set by the executive
- 11 branch department that oversees business regulation. This term shall
- 12 also apply to any person enrolled in a state or federal public assistance
- 13 program including, but not limited to, Temporary Assistance for Needy
- 14 Families (TANF), Medicaid, and Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
- 15 Program (SNAP);

- 16 (4) "Military families", any active duty service members and their
- 17 spouses and honorably discharged veterans and their
- 18 spouses. Surviving spouses of deceased service members who have not
- 19 remarried are also included;
 - (5) "Occupational fee", a fee or tax on professionals or businesses

21that is charged for the privilege of providing goods or services within 22a certain jurisdiction;

- (6) "Political subdivision", a city, town, village, or county;
- 24 (7) "Young workers", any applicants who are between the ages of 25eighteen and twenty-five.
 - 2. All state and political subdivision licensing authorities shall waive all occupational fees and fees from licensing requirements, for the first year of licensure, for low-income families, military families, and young workers.
- 30 3. Individuals seeking a waiver of occupational fees and fees from licensing requirements shall apply to the appropriate licensing 31 authority in a format prescribed by such licensing authority. The 3233 licensing authority shall process such applications within thirty days of receiving them. 34
- 4. The division of professional registration within the department of insurance, financial institutions and professional registration shall promulgate rules to implement this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536, and, if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the 44 effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28, 2018, shall be invalid and void.
