19	(3) Knowingly manufactures, delivers, or distributes a
20	Schedule I or II controlled substance, as described in section
21	195.017 and regulations promulgated by the department of health
22	and senior services and excluding marijuana for medical use as
23	authorized by article XVI of the Missouri Constitution, in
24	violation of chapters 195 or 579, and such controlled substance

thereafter is the proximate cause of the death of another person
who uses or consumes such controlled substance. It shall not be
a defense that the defendant did not directly deliver or
distribute the controlled substance to the decedent.

- 2. The offense of murder in the second degree is a class A felony, and the punishment for second degree murder shall be in addition to the punishment for commission of a related felony or attempted felony, other than murder or manslaughter.
- 3. Notwithstanding section 556.046 and section 565.029, in any charge of murder in the second degree, the jury shall be instructed on, or, in a jury-waived trial, the judge shall consider, any and all of the subdivisions in subsection 1 of this section which are supported by the evidence and requested by one of the parties or the court."; and
