by inserting after all of said line the following: 2 "262.217. Effective September 1, 1995, there is 3 created a "State Fair Commission" whose domicile for the 4 purposes of sections 262.215 to 262.280 shall be the 5 department of agriculture of this state. The commission 6 7 shall consist of [nine] twelve members, [two of whom shall 8 be active farmers, two of whom shall be either current 9 members or past presidents of county or regional fair 10 boards, one of whom shall be the director of the department of agriculture[, one of whom shall be employed in 11 agribusiness, and three at-large members who shall be 12 Missouri residents]. The director of the department of 13 14 agriculture [shall be the chairman of the commission until 15 January 31, 1997, and] shall not be counted against 16 membership from a congressional district[, at which time]. 17 The [chairman] chair shall be elected from among the members of the commission by the commission members. Such officer 18 shall serve for a term of two years. Commissioners shall be 19 20 reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred 21 when attending meetings of the commission, to be paid from appropriations made therefor. Commissioners shall be 22 23 appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the senate. [The county fair association in the state may 24 submit to the governor a list of nominees for appointment, 25 three from each congressional district, for those commission 26

27 members who are required to be current members or past presidents of county fair boards. Not more than four 28 commissioners excluding the director of agriculture shall be 29 members of the same political party.] Each commissioner 30 shall be a resident of the state for five years prior to 31 32 [his] the commissioner's appointment. The eight initial commissioners shall be appointed as follows: two shall be 33 34 appointed for terms of one year, two for terms of two years, 35 two for terms of three years and two for terms of four 36 years. Their successors shall be appointed for terms of four years. A commissioner shall continue to serve until 37 [his] a successor is appointed and qualified. Whenever any 38 39 vacancy occurs on the commission, the governor shall fill the vacancy by appointment for the remainder of the term of 40 the commissioner who was replaced. There shall be no more 41 42 than [two] three commission members from any congressional

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district."; and
