## SENATE BILL NO. 88

## AN ACT

To amend chapter 324, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to professional licensing.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 324, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 one new section, to be known as section 324.004, to read as
- 3 follows:
  - 324.004. 1. Any person who has at least three years
- 2 of work experience in an occupation or profession in another
- 3 state, the District of Columbia, or any combination of such
- 4 jurisdictions, and whose work experience involved the
- 5 practice of an occupation or profession for which a license
- 6 is not required in the jurisdiction or jurisdictions in
- 7 which the person worked, but is required in this state, may
- 8 submit an application for a one-time, nonrenewable one-year
- 9 temporary license in this state in the occupation or
- 10 profession, along with proof of at least three years of work
- 11 experience in the occupation or profession, and a fee as set
- 12 by regulation of the oversight body, to the relevant
- oversight body in this state. The oversight body shall make
- 14 a determination of qualification within forty-five days of
- 15 receiving a completed application. As used in this section,
- 16 "oversight body" shall mean any board, department, agency,
- or office of a jurisdiction that issues licenses.
- 18 2. The oversight body may require an applicant to take
- 19 and pass the profession-specific examination required for
- 20 licensure by those applying pursuant to the provisions of

- 21 the oversight body's statutory and regulatory authority. An
- 22 oversight body that administers an examination on the laws
- 23 of this state as part of its licensing application
- 24 requirements may require an applicant under this section to
- 25 take and pass an examination specific to the laws of this
- 26 state.
- 27 3. The oversight body shall not issue a one-time
- 28 nonrenewable temporary license to any applicant described in
- 29 subsection 1 of this section who has had any license in the
- 30 relevant occupation or profession revoked by an oversight
- 31 body outside of this state, who is currently under
- 32 investigation, who has a complaint pending, or who is
- 33 currently under disciplinary action.
- 4. The oversight body may require the applicant to
- 35 submit to federal and state fingerprint or other biometric
- 36 background checks.
- 37 5. Applicants for the one-time nonrenewable temporary
- 38 license shall be citizens of the United States and shall
- 39 submit legal proof of citizenship as part of the application.
- 40 <u>6. The provisions of this section shall not apply to</u>
- 41 the following:
- 42 (1) Any occupation whose oversight body has entered
- 43 into a licensing compact with another state for the
- 44 regulation of practice under the oversight body's
- 45 jurisdiction. The provisions of this section shall not be
- 46 construed to alter the authority granted by, or any
- 47 requirements promulgated pursuant to, any
- 48 interjurisdictional or interstate compacts adopted by this
- 49 state or any reciprocity agreements with other states, and
- 50 whenever possible the provisions of this section shall be
- 51 interpreted so as to imply no conflict between it and any
- 52 compact or any reciprocity agreement with other states; or

- 53 (2) Any occupation set forth in subsection 6 of

  54 section 290.257 or any electrical contractor licensed under

  55 sections 324.900 to 324.945.
- 7. The one-time nonrenewable temporary license shall
  expire after one year. Upon expiration, the oversight body
  shall issue a permanent license to the individual in the
  occupation for which he or she held the one-time,
  nonrenewable temporary license, unless the individual is
  currently under investigation, has a complaint pending, or
  is currently under disciplinary action.
- 8. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
  contrary, a license issued under this section shall be valid
  only in this state and shall not make a licensee eligible to
  be part of an interstate compact. An applicant who is
  licensed in another state pursuant to an interstate compact
  shall not be eligible for licensure by an oversight body
  under the provisions of this section.
  - 9. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, a license issued under this section shall be valid only in this state and shall not make a licensee eligible to obtain a license by reciprocity in another state.

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74 10. The division of professional registration may promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this 75 76 section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is created under the 77 78 authority delegated in this section shall become effective 79 only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, section 80 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and 81 82 if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective 83 date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently 84

held unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking

- 86 authority and any rule proposed or adopted after August 28,
- 87 2023, shall be invalid and void.
