## AN ACT

To repeal section 301.142, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to transportation for disabled persons, with existing penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

	Section A. Section 301.142, RSMo, is repealed and one new
2	section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 301.142,
3	to read as follows:
	301.142. 1. As used in sections 301.141 to 301.143,
2	the following terms mean:
3	(1) "Department", the department of revenue;
4	(2) "Director", the director of the department of
5	revenue;
6	(3) "Other authorized health care practitioner"
7	includes advanced practice registered nurses licensed
8	pursuant to chapter 335, physician assistants licensed
9	pursuant to chapter 334, chiropractors licensed pursuant to
10	chapter 331, podiatrists licensed pursuant to chapter 330,
11	assistant physicians, physical therapists licensed pursuant
12	to chapter 334, and optometrists licensed pursuant to
13	chapter 336;
14	(4) "Physically disabled", a natural person who is
15	blind, as defined in section 8.700, or a natural person with
16	medical disabilities which prohibits, limits, or severely
17	impairs one's ability to ambulate or walk, as determined by

18 a licensed physician or other authorized health care 19 practitioner as follows:

20 (a) The person cannot ambulate or walk fifty or less
21 feet without stopping to rest due to a severe and disabling
22 arthritic, neurological, orthopedic condition, or other
23 severe and disabling condition; or

(b) The person cannot ambulate or walk without the use of, or assistance from, a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device, wheelchair, or other assistive device; or

(c) Is restricted by a respiratory or other disease to
such an extent that the person's forced respiratory
expiratory volume for one second, when measured by
spirometry, is less than one liter, or the arterial oxygen
tension is less than sixty mm/hg on room air at rest; or

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(d) Uses portable oxygen; or

34 (e) Has a cardiac condition to the extent that the
35 person's functional limitations are classified in severity
36 as class III or class IV according to standards set by the
37 American Heart Association; or

(f) Except as otherwise provided in subdivision (4) of subsection 16 of this section, a person's age, in and of itself, shall not be a factor in determining whether such person is physically disabled or is otherwise entitled to disabled license plates and/or disabled windshield hanging placards within the meaning of sections 301.141 to 301.143;

44 (5) "Physician", a person licensed to practice45 medicine pursuant to chapter 334;

46 (6) "Physician's statement", a statement personally
47 signed by a duly authorized person which certifies that a
48 person is disabled as defined in this section;

49 (7) "Temporarily disabled person", a disabled person
50 as defined in this section whose disability or incapacity is
51 expected to last no more than one hundred eighty days;

(8) "Temporary windshield placard", a placard to be issued to persons who are temporarily disabled persons as defined in this section, certification of which shall be indicated on the physician's statement;

(9) "Windshield placard", a placard to be issued to
persons who are physically disabled as defined in this
section, certification of which shall be indicated on the
physician's statement.

60 2. Other authorized health care practitioners may
61 furnish to a disabled or temporarily disabled person a
62 physician's statement for only those physical health care
63 conditions for which such health care practitioner is
64 legally authorized to diagnose and treat.

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3. A physician's statement shall:

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(1) Be on a form prescribed by the director of revenue;

67 (2) Set forth the specific diagnosis and medical
68 condition which renders the person physically disabled or
69 temporarily disabled as defined in this section;

70 (3) Include the physician's or other authorized health71 care practitioner's license number; and

72 (4) Be personally signed by the issuing physician or73 other authorized health care practitioner.

4. If it is the professional opinion of the physician
or other authorized health care practitioner issuing the
statement that the physical disability of the applicant,
user, or member of the applicant's household is permanent,
it shall be noted on the statement. Otherwise, the
physician or other authorized health care practitioner shall
note on the statement the anticipated length of the

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disability, which shall determine the expiration date for the temporary windshield placard, and which period [may] shall not exceed one hundred eighty days. If the physician or health care practitioner fails to record an expiration date on the physician's statement, the director shall issue a temporary windshield placard for a period of thirty days.

5. A physician or other authorized health care 87 practitioner who issues or signs a physician's statement so 88 that disabled plates or a disabled windshield placard may be 89 90 obtained shall maintain in such disabled person's medical chart documentation that such a certificate has been issued, 91 the date the statement was signed, the diagnosis or 92 93 condition which existed that qualified the person as disabled pursuant to this section and shall contain 94 sufficient documentation so as to objectively confirm that 95 96 such condition exists.

97 6. The medical or other records of the physician or other authorized health care practitioner who issued a 98 99 physician's statement shall be open to inspection and review 100 by such practitioner's licensing board, in order to verify compliance with this section. Information contained within 101 such records shall be confidential unless required for 102 prosecution, disciplinary purposes, or otherwise required to 103 104 be disclosed by law.

105 Owners of motor vehicles who are residents of the 7. 106 state of Missouri, and who are physically disabled, owners 107 of motor vehicles operated at least fifty percent of the time by a physically disabled person, or owners of motor 108 vehicles used to primarily transport physically disabled 109 110 members of the owner's household may obtain disabled person 111 license plates. Such owners, upon application[,] to the 112 director accompanied by the documents and fees provided for

113 in this section, a current physician's statement which has 114 been issued within ninety days proceeding the date the 115 application is made, and proof of compliance with the state motor vehicle laws relating to registration and licensing of 116 117 motor vehicles, shall be issued motor vehicle license plates for vehicles, other than commercial vehicles with a gross 118 119 weight in excess of twenty-four thousand pounds, upon which 120 shall be inscribed the international wheelchair 121 accessibility symbol and the word "DISABLED" in addition to 122 a combination of letters and numbers. Such license plates shall be made with fully reflective material with a common 123 color scheme and design, shall be clearly visible at night, 124 125 and shall be aesthetically attractive, as prescribed by 126 section 301.130. If at any time an individual who obtained 127 disabled license plates issued under this subsection no 128 longer occupies a residence with a physically disabled 129 person, or no longer owns a vehicle that is operated at least fifty percent of the time by a physically disabled 130 person, such individual shall surrender the disabled license 131 plates to the department within thirty days of becoming 132 ineligible for their use. 133

8. The director shall further issue, upon request, to 134 such applicant one, and for good cause shown, as the 135 136 director may define by rule and regulations, not more than 137 two, removable disabled windshield hanging placards for use when the disabled person is occupying a vehicle or when a 138 139 vehicle not bearing the permanent handicap plate is being used to pick up, deliver, or collect the physically disabled 140 person issued the disabled motor vehicle license plate or 141 142 disabled windshield hanging placard.

143 9. No additional fee shall be paid to the director for144 the issuance of the special license plates provided in this

145 section, except for special personalized license plates and 146 other license plates described in this subsection. Priority 147 for any specific set of special license plates shall be given to the applicant who received the number in the 148 149 immediately preceding license period subject to the 150 applicant's compliance with the provisions of this section and any applicable rules or regulations issued by the 151 152 director. If determined feasible by the advisory committee established in section 301.129, any special license plate 153 154 issued pursuant to this section may be adapted to also 155 include the international wheelchair accessibility symbol and the word "DISABLED" as prescribed in this section and 156 157 such plate may be issued to any applicant who meets the 158 requirements of this section and the other appropriate 159 provision of this chapter, subject to the requirements and 160 fees of the appropriate provision of this chapter.

161 10. Any physically disabled person, or the parent or 162 guardian of any such person, or any not-for-profit group, organization, or other entity which transports more than one 163 physically disabled person, may apply to the director of 164 revenue for a removable windshield placard. The placard may 165 be used in motor vehicles which do not bear the permanent 166 handicap symbol on the license plate. Such placards must be 167 168 hung from the front, middle rearview mirror of a parked 169 motor vehicle and may not be hung from the mirror during 170 operation. These placards may only be used during the period of time when the vehicle is being used by a disabled 171 person, or when the vehicle is being used to pick up, 172 deliver, or collect a disabled person, and shall be 173 surrendered to the department, within thirty days, if a 174 group, organization, or entity that obtained the removable 175 windshield placard due to the transportation of more than 176

177 one physically disabled person no longer transports more 178 than one disabled person. When there is no rearview mirror, 179 the placard shall be displayed on the dashboard on the 180 driver's side.

The removable windshield placard shall conform to 181 11. 182 the specifications, in respect to size, color, and content, as set forth in federal regulations published by the 183 184 Department of Transportation. The removable windshield 185 placard shall be renewed every [four] eight years. The director shall have the authority to automatically extend 186 the expiration date of current valid windshield placards, 187 other than temporary windshield placards, to a duration of 188 eight years until all windshield placards other than 189 190 temporary windshield placards are on an eight year renewal 191 cycle. The director may stagger the expiration dates to 192 equalize workload. Only one removable placard may be issued 193 to an applicant who has been issued disabled person license plates. Upon request, one additional windshield placard may 194 195 be issued to an applicant who has not been issued disabled person license plates. 196

197 12. A temporary windshield placard shall be issued to any physically disabled person, or the parent or quardian of 198 199 any such person who otherwise qualifies except that the 200 physical disability, in the opinion of the physician, is not 201 expected to exceed a period of one hundred eighty days. The 202 temporary windshield placard shall conform to the specifications, in respect to size, color, and content, as 203 set forth in federal regulations published by the Department 204 of Transportation. The fee for the temporary windshield 205 206 placard shall be two dollars. Upon request, and for good 207 cause shown, one additional temporary windshield placard may be issued to an applicant. Temporary windshield placards 208

209 shall be issued upon presentation of the physician's 210 statement provided by this section and shall be displayed in 211 the same manner as removable windshield placards. A person or entity shall be qualified to possess and display a 212 temporary removable windshield placard for six months and 213 214 the placard may be renewed once for an additional six months 215 if a physician's statement pursuant to this section is 216 supplied to the director of revenue at the time of renewal.

13. [Application for license plates or windshield placards issued pursuant to this section shall be made to the director of revenue and shall be accompanied by a statement signed by a licensed physician or other authorized health care practitioner which certifies that the applicant, user, or member of the applicant's household is a physically disabled person as defined by this section.

224 14. The] A windshield placard shall be renewable only 225 by the person or entity to which the placard was originally issued. Any placard issued pursuant to this section shall 226 227 only be used when the physically disabled occupant for whom the disabled plate or placard was issued is in the motor 228 vehicle at the time of parking or when a physically disabled 229 person is being delivered or collected. A disabled license 230 plate and/or a removable windshield hanging placard are not 231 232 transferable and may not be used by any other person whether 233 disabled or not.

[15.] 14. At the time the disabled plates or windshield hanging placards are issued, the director shall issue a registration certificate which shall include the applicant's name, address, and other identifying information as prescribed by the director, or if issued to an agency, such agency's name and address. This certificate shall further contain the disabled license plate number or, for

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241 windshield hanging placards, the registration or identifying 242 number stamped on the placard. The validated registration 243 receipt given to the applicant shall serve as the 244 registration certificate.

[16.] **15.** The director shall, upon issuing any 245 246 disabled registration certificate for license plates and/or windshield hanging placards, provide information which 247 explains that such plates or windshield hanging placards are 248 nontransferable, and the restrictions explaining who and 249 250 when a person or vehicle which bears or has the disabled plates or windshield hanging placards may be used or be 251 parked in a disabled reserved parking space, and the 252 253 penalties prescribed for violations of the provisions of 254 this act.

255 [17.] **16**. (**1**) Except as otherwise provided in this 256 subsection, every [new] applicant for issuance or renewal of 257 a disabled license plate or placard shall be required to present a new physician's statement dated no more than 258 259 ninety days prior to such application. [Renewal applicants will be required to submit a physician's statement dated no 260 more than ninety days prior to such application upon their 261 first renewal occurring on or after August 1, 2005. Upon 262 completing subsequent renewal applications, a physician's 263 264 statement dated no more than ninety days prior to such 265 application shall be required every eighth year. Such 266 physician's statement shall state the expiration date for 267 the temporary windshield placard. If the physician fails to record an expiration date on the physician's statement, the 268 director shall issue the temporary windshield placard for a 269 270 period of thirty days. The director may stagger the 271 requirement of a physician's statement on all renewals for 272 the initial implementation of an eight-year period.]

(2) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the
contrary, if the applicant has presented proof of disability
in the form of a statement from the United States Veterans'
Administration verifying that the person is permanently
disabled, the applicant shall not be required to provide a
physician's statement for the purpose of issuance or renewal
of disabled persons license plates or windshield placards.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (f) of
subdivision (4) of subsection 1 of this section, any person
seventy-five years of age or older who provided a
physician's statement with the original application shall
not be required to provide a physician's statement for the
purpose of renewal of disabled persons license plates or
windshield placards.

287 [18.] **17.** The director of revenue upon receiving a 288 physician's statement pursuant to this subsection shall 289 check with the state board of registration for the healing arts created in section 334.120, or the Missouri state board 290 291 of nursing established in section 335.021, with respect to physician's statements signed by advanced practice 292 registered nurses, or the Missouri state board of 293 chiropractic examiners established in section 331.090, with 294 respect to physician's statements signed by licensed 295 296 chiropractors, or with the board of optometry established in 297 section 336.130, with respect to physician's statements signed by licensed optometrists, or the state board of 298 podiatric medicine created in section 330.100, with respect 299 to physician's statements signed by physicians of the foot 300 or podiatrists to determine whether the physician is duly 301 302 licensed and registered pursuant to law. [If such applicant 303 obtaining a disabled license plate or placard presents proof of disability in the form of a statement from the United 304

States Veterans' Administration verifying that the person is 305 306 permanently disabled, the applicant shall be exempt from the 307 eight-year certification requirement of this subsection for renewal of the plate or placard. Initial applications shall 308 309 be accompanied by the physician's statement required by this 310 section. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (f) of subdivision (4) of subsection 1 of this section, any person 311 312 seventy-five years of age or older who provided the physician's statement with the original application shall 313 314 not be required to provide a physician's statement for the purpose of renewal of disabled persons license plates or 315 windshield placards. 316

317 19.] 18. The boards shall cooperate with the director 318 and shall supply information requested pursuant to this 319 subsection. The director shall, in cooperation with the 320 boards which shall assist the director, establish a list of 321 all Missouri physicians and other authorized health care 322 practitioners and of any other information necessary to 323 administer this section.

324 [20.] **19.** Where the owner's application is based on the fact that the vehicle is used at least fifty percent of 325 the time by a physically disabled person, the applicant 326 shall submit a statement stating this fact, in addition to 327 328 the physician's statement. The statement shall be signed by 329 both the owner of the vehicle and the physically disabled 330 person. The applicant shall be required to submit this 331 statement with each application for license plates. No 332 person shall willingly or knowingly submit a false statement and any such false statement shall be considered perjury and 333 334 may be punishable pursuant to section 301.420.

335 [21.] 20. The director of revenue shall retain all336 physicians' statements and all other documents received in

337 connection with a person's application for disabled license 338 plates and/or disabled windshield placards.

339 [22.] 21. The director of revenue shall enter into 340 reciprocity agreements with other states or the federal 341 government for the purpose of recognizing disabled person 342 license plates or windshield placards issued to physically 343 disabled persons.

344 [23.] 22. When a person to whom disabled person license plates or a removable or temporary windshield 345 346 placard or both have been issued dies, the personal representative of the decedent or such other person who may 347 come into or otherwise take possession of the disabled 348 349 license plates or disabled windshield placard shall return 350 the same to the director of revenue under penalty of law. 351 Failure to return such plates or placards shall constitute a class B misdemeanor. 352

353 [24.] 23. The director of revenue may order any person 354 issued disabled person license plates or windshield placards 355 to submit to an examination by a chiropractor, osteopath, or 356 physician, or to such other investigation as will determine 357 whether such person qualifies for the special plates or 358 placards.

359 [25.] 24. If such person refuses to submit or is found 360 to no longer qualify for special plates or placards provided 361 for in this section, the director of revenue shall collect 362 the special plates or placards, and shall furnish license 363 plates to replace the ones collected as provided by this 364 chapter.

365 [26.] 25. In the event a removable or temporary 366 windshield placard is lost, stolen, or mutilated, the lawful 367 holder thereof shall, within five days, file with the 368 director of revenue an application and an affidavit stating

369 such fact, in order to purchase a new placard. The fee for 370 the replacement windshield placard shall be four dollars.

371 [27.] 26. Fraudulent application, renewal, issuance, procurement or use of disabled person license plates or 372 windshield placards shall be a class A misdemeanor. 373 It is a 374 class B misdemeanor for a physician, chiropractor, podiatrist or optometrist to certify that an individual or 375 family member is qualified for a license plate or windshield 376 377 placard based on a disability, the diagnosis of which is outside their scope of practice or if there is no basis for 378 379 the diagnosis.

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
