AN ACT

To repeal section 167.903, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to workforce development in elementary and secondary education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 167.903, RSMo, is repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections 167.903 and 167.907, to read as follows:

167.903. 1. The department of elementary and 2 secondary education shall establish a process by which each 3 student prior to [his or her] the student's ninth grade year at a public school, including a charter school, [may] shall 4 5 develop with help from the student's parent or guardian and the school's [guidance] counselors [a personal]an individual 6 career and academic plan [of study], which shall be reviewed 7 [regularly, as needed] annually by school personnel and the 8 9 student's parent or guardian and updated based upon the 10 needs of the student. Each plan shall present a sequence of courses and experiences that conclude with the student 11 reaching [his or her] the student's postsecondary goals, with 12 implementation of the plan of study transferring to the 13 program of postsecondary education or training upon the 14 student's high school graduation. The plan shall include, 15 16 but not be limited to: 17 (1) Requirements for graduation from the school

18 district or charter school;

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(2) Career or postsecondary goals;

20 (3) Coursework or program of study related to career 21 and postsecondary goals, which shall include, if relevant, 22 opportunities that the district or school may not directly 23 offer;

24 (4) Grade-appropriate and career-related experiences,
25 as outlined in the grade-level expectations of the Missouri
26 comprehensive guidance program; and

(5) Student assessments, interest inventories, or
academic results needed to develop, review, and revise the
personal plan of study, which shall include, if relevant,
assessments, inventories, or academic results that the
school district or charter school may not offer.

32 2. Each school district shall adopt a policy to permit
33 the waiver of the requirements of this section for any
34 student with a disability if recommended by the student's
35 IEP committee. For purposes of this subsection, "IEP" means
36 individualized education program.

37 3. Prior to the completion of the second semester of 38 the student's twelfth-grade year, each student shall 39 include, as part of the student's individual career and 40 academic plan, a declaration of the student's postsecondary 41 plans including, but not limited to, the following:

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(1) Confirmation of employment upon graduation;

43 (2) Acceptance to an institution of higher education,
44 whether a two-year institution or a four-year institution;

45 (3) Acceptance to participate in a vocational,
46 technical, or other training program designed to prepare the
47 student for employment; or

48 (4) Commitment to enlist in the Armed Forces of the49 United States.

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167.907. 1. Beginning July 1, 2024, each school
district shall establish a process in which a student
completes and submits the Free Application for Federal
Student Aid, as maintained by the United States Department
of Education.

2. A student or a student's parent or guardian may
decline completing or submitting the Free Application for
Federal Student Aid under subsection 1 of this section if
such student submits to the student's school:

10 (1) A written confirmation of a commitment to enlist
11 in the Armed Forces of the United States; or

(2) A written confirmation signed by the student or
student's parent or guardian attesting that the student
understands what the application is and has chosen not to
file such application.

3. At any time, the superintendent or superintendent's designee shall exempt such student from any requirement to complete or submit the application if such student is unable to complete the application because of extenuating circumstances as determined by the local district.

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
