## AN ACT

To amend chapter 324, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to exemptions from continuing education requirements for certain licensed professionals.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

	Section A. Chapter 324, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto
2	one new section, to be known as section 324.018, to read as
3	follows:
	324.018. 1. For the purposes of this section, the
2	following terms shall mean:
3	(1) "Continuing education requirement", a licensee's
4	obligation to complete training or educational activities to
5	satisfy the standards of the licensing authority in order to
6	renew or maintain a license;
7	(2) "License", a license, certificate, registration,
8	permit, or accreditation that enables a person to legally
9	practice an occupation, profession, or activity in the state;
10	(3) "Licensing authority", an agency, examining board,
11	credentialing board, or other office of the state with the
12	authority to impose occupational fees or licensing
13	requirements on any profession. For purposes of the
14	provisions of this section, the term "licensing authority"
15	shall not include the state board of education's licensure
16	of teachers pursuant to chapter 168, the Missouri state
17	board of accountant's licensure of accountants pursuant to
18	chapter 326, the board of podiatric medicine's licensure of

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podiatrists pursuant to chapter 330, the Missouri dental 19 20 board's licensure of dentists pursuant to chapter 332, the 21 state board of registration for the healing art's licensure of physicians and surgeons pursuant to chapter 334, the 22 Missouri state board of nursing's licensure of nurses 23 24 pursuant to chapter 335, the board of pharmacy's licensure of pharmacists pursuant to chapter 338, the Missouri real 25 26 estate commission's licensure of real estate brokers, real 27 estate salespersons, real estate broker-salespersons, real 28 estate appraisers, or real estate appraisal management 29 companies pursuant to sections 339.010 to 339.549, the 30 Missouri veterinary medical board's licensure of veterinarians pursuant to chapter 340, the Missouri director 31 32 of finance appointed pursuant to chapter 361, or the peace 33 officer standards and training commission's licensure of 34 peace officers or other law enforcement personnel pursuant 35 to chapter 590;

36 (4) "Reporting period", a period of time in which a
37 licensing authority requires a licensee to certify
38 compliance with a continuing education requirement in order
39 to renew or maintain a license.

2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
contrary, a licensing authority shall issue an exemption to
a licensee from a continuing education requirement for a
reporting period, if the licensee:

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(1) Holds a current valid license; and

45 (2) Self-certifies to having actively participated in
46 the practice of the licensed occupation for no less than one
47 thousand hours every twelve months during the applicable
48 reporting period.

A licensee seeking an exemption described under
 subsection 2 of this section shall apply to the appropriate

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51 licensing authority in a format prescribed by the licensing 52 authority. The licensing authority shall approve or deny 53 the application for exemption within thirty days of receipt.

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4. A licensing authority shall post a permanent and
conspicuous notice of the exemption described under
subsection 2 of this section on the website maintained by
the relevant licensing authority.

58 5. Nothing in this section shall be construed to 59 relieve a licensee from obtaining any continuing education 60 requirement that is necessary for the licensee to comply 61 with any provision of federal law.

62 6. The provisions of this section shall not apply to 63 any person or entity whose licensure is subject to the 64 provisions of an interstate compact that has been adopted by 65 this state and codified in state statute.

66 7. A licensing authority shall promulgate any 67 necessary rules to implement this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 68 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in 69 70 this section shall become effective only if it complies with 71 and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, 72 if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 73 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with 74 the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule 75 are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of 76 rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after 77 78 August 28, 2023, shall be invalid and void.

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
