AN ACT

To amend chapter 168, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to salaries for school district personnel.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 168, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 one new section, to be known as section 168.800, to read as
- 3 follows:
 - 168.800. 1. As used in this section, the following
- 2 terms shall mean:
- 3 (1) "Department", department of elementary and
- 4 secondary education;
- 5 (2) "Salary", the salary figure which appears on the
- 6 teacher's contract and as determined by the local school
- 7 district's basic salary schedule, not including supplements
- 8 for extra duties;
- 9 (3) "Teacher", as defined in section 163.011.
- 10 2. There is hereby created in the state treasury the
- 11 "Missouri Public School Salary Equalization Fund", which
- 12 shall consist of moneys collected under this section for the
- 13 purpose of providing supplemental funding to school
- 14 districts and charter schools that certify to the
- 15 department, as provided in this section and rules
- 16 promulgated under subsection 11 of this section, that the
- 17 district or charter school meets either of the following
- 18 conditions:

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- 19 (1) The average teacher salary for the district or 20 charter school is below the statewide average teacher 21 salary; or
- 22 (2) The district or charter school is experiencing 23 sustained labor shortages for positions vital to providing 24 an adequate education to students, including: classroom 25 teachers for difficult to fill academic areas, substitute 26 teachers, and school counselors.
- The state treasurer shall be the custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon appropriation, moneys in the fund shall be used solely for the administration of this section.
- 32 3. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to 33 the contrary, any moneys remaining in the fund at the end of 34 the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the general 35 revenue fund.
- 4. The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund.
- 5. By the fifteenth of November each year, the commissioner of education shall present to the joint committee on education information concerning:
- 43 (1) The average Missouri teacher's salary, regional 44 average salary data, and national average salary data;
- 45 (2) An assessment of whether the state's teacher
 46 salaries are competitive with other states of similar
 47 economies and school-age populations; and
- 48 (3) Labor shortages impacting schools' ability to fill 49 positions vital to providing an adequate education to

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50 students, including classroom teachers for difficult to fill

- 51 academic areas, substitute teachers, and school counselors.
- 52 The joint committee on education shall, no later than
- January first each year, issue a report to the house budget
- 54 committee and the senate appropriations committee that
- 55 includes the joint committee's recommendation for the amount
- of funds that should be appropriated to the "Missouri Public
- 57 School Salary Equalization Fund" in order to adequately fund
- 58 the provisions and goals of this section.
- 59 6. To receive moneys from the fund, school districts
- 60 shall be required to submit documentation to the department
- 61 showing that the local tax base and any other revenue
- 62 allocated to education is:
- (1) Insufficient to employ the labor force necessary
- 64 to provide an adequate education to students, including
- 65 classroom teachers for difficult to fill academic areas,
- 66 substitute teachers, and school counselors; or
- 67 (2) Unable to cover the cost of teacher salaries such
- 68 that the district's average salary matches or exceeds the
- 69 statewide average teacher salary.
- 70 7. If moneys in the fund are insufficient to fully
- 71 fund the provisions of this section in a given school year,
- 72 the department shall prorate available funds as provided in
- 73 this subsection. For districts demonstrating need under
- 74 subdivision (2) of subsection 6 of this section, the
- 75 department shall disburse moneys in the fund to eligible
- 76 districts on a pro rata basis based on the difference
- 77 between the eligible district's average teacher salary and
- 78 the statewide average teacher salary. For districts
- 79 demonstrating need under subdivision (1) of subsection 6 of
- 80 this section, the department shall prorate funds on a pro

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- 81 rata basis in a manner that prioritizes teacher salaries in
- 82 difficult to fill areas over school counselors and
- 83 substitute teachers, as provided in rules promulgated under
- 84 subsection 11 of this section.
- 85 8. Notwithstanding any provision of this section to
- 86 the contrary, in order to qualify for funding under this
- 87 section, a school district or, in the case of a charter
- 88 school, the school district in which the charter school is
- 89 located shall:
- 90 (1) Levy an "adjusted operating levy" equal to or
- 91 greater than the "performance levy" as such terms are
- 92 defined in section 163.011; and
- 93 (2) Not have reduced the district's adjusted operating
- 94 levy in the current or first preceding school year, provided
- 95 that any tax rate required to be reduced pursuant to article
- 96 X, section 22 of the Missouri constitution or section
- 97 137.073 shall not disqualify the district or charter school
- 98 from receiving grants under this subdivision.
- 99 9. Subject to appropriations, a school district or
- 100 charter school shall continue to receive moneys from the
- 101 fund in the same amount as the preceding fiscal year in
- 102 addition to the amount eligible for the current fiscal year,
- 103 provided they remain in compliance with subsection 8 of this
- 104 section and continue to demonstrate sufficient need. A
- 105 school district or charter school qualifying for grants
- 106 under subdivision (2) of subsection 6 of this section with
- 107 an average teacher salary meeting or exceeding the statewide
- 108 average salary is ineligible to receive moneys from the fund
- 109 exceeding the amount received by the school district in the
- 110 previous year.
- 111 10. All funds provided to a school district or charter
- 112 school under this section shall be expended only for teacher

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salaries and benefits, school counselor salaries and 113 114 benefits, or payments to substitute teachers, as applicable. The department shall promulgate rules to carry out 115 the provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a 116 rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is 117 118 created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to 119 120 all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable, 121 section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the 122 general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay 123 the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are 124 subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of 125 rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after 126 127 August 28, 2023, shall be invalid and void.

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
