AN ACT

To amend chapters 160 and 213, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to discriminatory practices.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Chapters 160 and 213, RSMo, are amended by Section A. 2 adding thereto two new sections, to be known as sections 160.082 3 and 213.012, to read as follows: 160.082. 1. For purposes of this section, the 2 following terms mean: 3 (1) "Educational institution", any public or private prekindergarten program, public or private elementary or 4 secondary school, or public or private school board or other 5 6 school administrative body; (2) 7 "Protective hairstyles", includes, but is not 8 limited to, such hairstyles as braids, locks, twists, and 9 afros; 10 (3) "Race", includes, but is not limited to, traits historically associated with race including, but not limited 11 12 to, hair texture and protective hairstyles. "Race" includes 13 a perception that a person is associated with another person who has, or is perceived to have, any qualities relating to 14 15 race; "State financial assistance", any funds or other 16 (4) 17 form of financial aid appropriated or authorized under the 18 laws of this state, or under any federal law administered by any state agency, for the purpose of providing assistance to 19 20 any educational institution for its own benefit or for the

21 benefit of any pupils admitted to the educational

22 institution. "State financial assistance" includes, but is 23 not limited to, all of the following:

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Grants of state property, or any interest therein; (a) 25 (b) Provision of the services of state personnel; and 26 Funds provided by contract, tax rebate, (C)

appropriation, allocation, or formula; 27

28 "State student financial aid", any funds or other (5) 29 form of financial aid appropriated or authorized under the 30 laws of this state, or under any federal law administered by any state agency, for the purpose of providing assistance 31 directly to any student admitted to an educational 32 institution. "State student financial aid" includes, but is 33 not limited to, scholarships, loans, grants, or wages. 34

2. No person shall be discriminated against on the 35 36 basis of race in any program or activity conducted by an 37 educational institution that receives or benefits from state financial assistance or enrolls students who receive state 38 student financial aid. 39

40 The provisions of subsection 2 of this section 3. shall not apply to an educational institution that is 41 42 controlled by a religious organization if the application would not be consistent with the religious tenets of that 43 44 organization.

213.012. As used in this chapter, the term "race" 2 includes traits historically associated with race including, 3 but not limited to, hair texture and protective hairstyles. The term "protective hairstyles" includes, but is not 4 limited to, such hairstyles as braids, locks, twists, and 5 6 afros.

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
