## **AN ACT**

To repeal section 324.520, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to tattooing, with existing penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 324.520, RSMo, is repealed and one new

- 2 section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 324.520,
- 3 to read as follows:
  - 324.520. 1. As used in sections 324.520 to 324.524,
- 2 the following terms mean:
- 3 (1) "Body piercing", the perforation of human tissue
- 4 other than an ear for a nonmedical purpose;
- 5 (2) "Branding", a permanent mark made on human tissue
- 6 by burning with a hot iron or other instrument;
- 7 (3) "Controlled substance", any substance defined in
- 8 section 195.010;
- 9 (4) "Minor", a person under the age of eighteen;
- 10 (5) "Tattoo", one or more of the following:
- 11 (a) An indelible mark made on the body of another
- 12 person by the insertion of a pigment under the skin; [or]
- 13 (b) An indelible design made on the body of another
- 14 person by production of scars other than by branding; or
- (c) A semi-permanent mark made on the body of another
- 16 person through the use of a small handheld tool made of
- 17 several tiny needles or blades that deposit pigment into the
- 18 upper region of the dermis.

EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

- No person shall knowingly tattoo, brand or perform 19 20 body piercing on a minor unless such person obtains the 21 prior written informed consent of the minor's parent or legal quardian. The minor's parent or legal quardian shall 22 23 execute the written informed consent required pursuant to 24 this subsection in the presence of the person performing the tattooing, branding or body piercing on the minor, or in the 25 26 presence of an employee or agent of such person. Any person 27 who fraudulently misrepresents himself or herself as a 28 parent is guilty of a class B misdemeanor.
  - 3. A person shall not tattoo, brand or perform body piercing on another person if the other person is under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a controlled substance.
    - 4. A person who violates any provisions of sections 324.520 to 324.526 is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars. If there is a subsequent violation within one year of the initial violation, such person shall be fined not less than five hundred dollars or more than one thousand dollars.
- 38 5. No person under the age of eighteen shall tattoo,39 brand or perform body piercing on another person.
