## **AN ACT**

To amend chapter 37, RSMo, by adding thereto four new sections relating to the Missouri geospatial advisory council.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 37, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto

- 2 four new sections, to be known as sections 37.1300, 37.1310,
- 3 37.1320, and 37.1330, to read as follows:

37.1300. For the purposes of sections 37.1300 to

- 2 37.1330, the following terms mean:
- 3 (1) "Council", the Missouri geospatial advisory
- 4 council established in section 37.1310;
- 5 (2) "Geographic information system (GIS)", a computer
- 6 system for capturing, storing, checking, and displaying data
- 7 related to positions on the Earth's surface that enables
- 8 easily seeing, analyzing, and understanding patterns and
- 9 relationships;
- 10 (3) "Geospatial", relating to or denoting data that is
- 11 associated with a particular location;
- 12 (4) "Missouri Spatial Data Information Service" or
- 13 "MSDIS", Missouri's primary spatial data clearinghouse
- 14 responsible for collecting and distributing vector data,
- 15 aerial photography, and light detection and ranging
- 16 elevation data that are generated, updated, and funded by
- 17 state, local, and regional agencies and governments.

37.1310. There is hereby established within the office

- 2 of administration the "Missouri Geospatial Advisory
- 3 Council", which is charged with assisting and advising the
- 4 state in ensuring the availability, implementation, and
- 5 enhancement of a statewide geospatial data infrastructure
- 6 common to all jurisdictions through research, planning,
- 7 training, and education. The council shall represent all
- 8 entities and jurisdictions before appropriate policy-making
- 9 authorities and the general assembly and shall strive
- 10 towards the immediate access to statewide geospatial data
- 11 for all citizens of this state, especially life-safety
- 12 entities. The council shall be established within the
- office of the commissioner of administration.
  - 37.1320. 1. The council shall consist of members as
- 2 follows:
- 3 (1) The commissioner of administration, or the
- 4 commissioner's designee;
- 5 (2) The director of the department of agriculture, or
- 6 the director's designee;
- 7 (3) The director of the department of conservation, or
- 8 the director's designee;
- 9 (4) The director of the department of economic
- 10 development, or the director's designee;
- 11 (5) The director of the department of elementary and
- 12 secondary education, or the director's designee;
- 13 (6) The director of the department of health and
- 14 senior services, or the director's designee;
- 15 (7) The director of the department of natural
- 16 resources, or the director's designee;
- 17 (8) The Missouri military advocate, or the advocate's
- 18 designee;

19 (9) The adjutant general of the department of the

- 20 national guard, or the adjutant general's designee;
- 21 (10) The director of the department of public safety,

- 22 or the director's designee;
- 23 (11) The director of the department of revenue, or the
- 24 director's designee;
- 25 (12) The director of the department of social
- 26 services, or the director's designee;
- 27 (13) The director of the department of transportation,
- 28 or the director's designee;
- 29 (14) The director of the United States Geological
- 30 Survey, or the director's designee;
- 31 (15) The director of the United States Department of
- 32 Agriculture Natural Resource Conservation Service, or the
- 33 director's designee;
- 34 (16) The director of the Missouri 911 service board,
- 35 or the director's designee;
- 36 (17) The president of the University of Missouri
- 37 system, or the president's designee;
- 38 (18) The director of the Missouri Spatial Data
- 39 Information Service, or the director's designee;
- 40 (19) The director of the National Geospatial
- 41 Intelligence Agency-West, or the director's designee;
- 42 (20) A member of the state senate, appointed by the
- 43 president pro tempore of the senate;
- 44 (21) A member of the house of representatives,
- 45 appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives;
- 46 (22) Thirteen citizens of Missouri, appointed by the
- 47 commissioner of administration. Such individuals shall
- 48 represent a geographic balance from within the state,
- 49 representing both rural and urban areas with at least one
- 50 individual from each of the seven Missouri economic

51 development regions, as determined by the Missouri economic

- 52 research information center. Such individuals shall
- additionally represent city, county, and local government;
- 54 the private sector; public safety; and academia; and
- 55 (23) Additional subject matter experts may participate
- 56 in activities as non-council members.

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- 2. Appointed members of the council shall serve threeyear terms and shall serve until their successors are appointed. Vacancies on the council shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment and such member appointed shall serve the remainder of the unexpired term.
  - 3. The council shall meet monthly and as otherwise required by the commissioner of the office of administration.
  - 4. The council shall designate from its members a chair and chair-elect for one-year terms and shall adopt written guidelines to govern the management of the council.
  - 5. Each member of the council shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for his or her actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of his or her duties as a member of the council.
  - 6. The commissioner of the office of administration shall designate an employee of the office of administration as executive secretary for the council, who shall serve as a nonvoting member and shall maintain the records of the council's activities and decisions and shall be responsible for correspondence between the council and other agencies.
  - 7. The council may apply for federal and state grant programs to sponsor and publish surveys of the condition and needs of geographic information in the state of Missouri and to solicit or develop proposals for projects to be carried out in the state for building and improving the state geospatial data infrastructure and workforce.

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83 8. The council may apply for federal and state grant 84 programs and conduct other business as it relates to the 85 development of geospatial workforce within Missouri.

- 9. The council shall provide recommendations on budget and staffing needs as it relates to the development of geospatial related projects and initiatives to the office of administration.
  - 37.1330. The council shall have the following duties:
- 2 (1) To establish public and private partnerships
  3 throughout Missouri to maximize value, minimize cost, and
  4 avoid redundant activities in the development and
  5 implementation of geographic information systems;
- 6 (2) To foster efficient and secure methods for data 7 sharing at all levels of government;
- 8 (3) To coordinate, review, and provide recommendations
  9 on geographic information systems programs and investments,
  10 and to provide assistance with dispute resolution among
  11 geographic systems partners;
  - (4) To continue to establish Missouri's leadership role in the national effort to improve capabilities for sharing geographic information and ideas with other states;
  - (5) To promote the use of geographic information systems technologies as tools for breaking through structural and administrative boundaries in order to collaborate on shared problems and enhance information analysis and decision-making processes within all levels of government;
  - (6) To provide input and recommendations for the development of a strategy for the maintenance and funding of a statewide base map and geographic information system;
- 24 (7) To work jointly with officials from other state 25 agencies, organizations, and county, municipal, and tribal

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governments as well as with businesses and organizations in the private sector that are concerned with the efficient management of the state's geographic information systems resources:

- (8) To recommend the development and adoption of policies and procedures related to geographic information and geographic information systems;
  - (9) To serve as the statewide governing body for sharing and managing geospatial framework data; and
  - (10) To provide oversight and guidance to the Missouri spatial data information service and provide recommendations on budget and staffing needs to the office of administration to implement the Missouri geospatial advisory council recommendations.
