## JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri, an amendment to article I of the Constitution of Missouri, by adding thereto one new section relating to the parents' bill of rights.

Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring therein:

	That at the next general election to be held in the
2	state of Missouri, on Tuesday next following the first Monday
3	in November, 2024, or at a special election to be called by
4	the governor for that purpose, there is hereby submitted to
5	the qualified voters of this state, for adoption or
6	rejection, the following amendment to article I of the
7	Constitution of the state of Missouri:
	Section A. Article I, Constitution of Missouri, is amended
2	by adding thereto one new section, to be known as section 36,
3	to read as follows:
	Section 36. 1. That the parents of Missouri's
2	children have a fundamental right to participate in and
3	direct the education of their children. Such rights shall
4	include, but are not limited to, the following:
5	(1) The right to transparent access to school and
6	school district curricula and lesson plans, made available
7	in an electronically searchable format and available at all
8	times online on the homepage of the website hosted by the
9	district and submitted to the state to affirm compliance;
10	(2) The right to transparent access to school and
11	school district academic performance information in an easy

12 to understand and electronically searchable format,

13 available at all times online on the homepage of the website 14 hosted by the district and based on data from the department 15 of elementary and secondary education or any successor 16 agency;

(3) The right to transparent access to school and
school district financial information in an easy to
understand and electronically searchable format, available
at all times online on the homepage of the website hosted by
the district and submitted to the state to affirm compliance;

22 The right to transparent access to contract (4) negotiations between the district and labor groups with whom 23 the district is considering entering into labor agreements 24 including access to all materials used in negotiation and 25 26 all finalized documents that describe the legal obligations of parties pursuant to an agreement. Such documents shall 27 28 be available in an electronically searchable format and available at all times online on the homepage of the website 29 hosted by the district and submitted to the state to affirm 30 compliance; 31

(5) The right to choose existing educational choice
 options provided by law that best suit the learning needs of
 their children;

(6) The right to request to opt their children out of
 the classroom for any presentation of content listed in the
 syllabus with which they disagree;

(7) The right to control their children's likeness in
 district materials, subject to exceptions such as court
 orders; and

41 (8) The right to control their children's health and
42 identifying markers, including but not limited to, the right

43 to opt out of health measures not required by state order or44 statute.

45 2. The general assembly shall have the power to
46 enforce this section by appropriate legislation.
