23	however, that] . Such information otherwise discoverable or
24	admissible from [original] other sources is not to be
25	construed as immune from discovery or use in any proceeding
26	merely because it was presented during proceedings before a

peer review committee nor is a member, employee, or agent of 27 such committee, or other person appearing before it, to be 28 prevented from testifying as to matters [within his personal 29 knowledge and] in accordance with the rules of evidence and 30 in accordance with the other provisions of this section, but 31 32 such witness cannot be questioned about [testimony or other proceedings before any health care review committee or board 33 34 or about] opinions formed as a result of such committee 35 hearings. [The disclosure of any interview, memoranda, proceedings, findings, deliberations, reports, or minutes to 36 any person or entity, including but not limited to 37 governmental agencies, professional accrediting agencies, or 38 other health care providers, whether proper or improper, 39 shall not waive or have any effect upon its confidentiality, 40 nondiscoverability, or nonadmissibility.]". 41
