# **SENATE BILL NO. 108**

### AN ACT

To repeal sections 191.1146 and 334.108, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to telemedicine.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 191.1146 and 334.108, RSMo, are 2 repealed and two new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be 3 known as sections 191.1146 and 334.108, to read as follows: 191.1146. 1. Physicians licensed under chapter 334 2 who use telemedicine shall ensure that a properly 3 established physician-patient relationship exists with the person who receives the telemedicine services. 4 The physician-patient relationship may be established by: 5 6 An in-person encounter through a medical (1)7 [interview] evaluation and physical examination; 8 (2) Consultation with another physician, or that 9 physician's delegate, who has an established relationship 10 with the patient and an agreement with the physician to participate in the patient's care; or 11 12 (3) A telemedicine encounter, if the standard of care 13 does not require an in-person encounter, and in accordance with evidence-based standards of practice and telemedicine 14 practice guidelines that address the clinical and 15 16 technological aspects of telemedicine. 17 2. In order to establish a physician-patient relationship through telemedicine: 18

(1) The technology utilized shall be sufficient to
establish an informed diagnosis as though the medical
[interview] evaluation and, if required to meet the standard
of care, the physical examination has been performed in
person; and

24 (2) Prior to providing treatment, including issuing 25 prescriptions or physician certifications under Article XIV of the Missouri Constitution, a physician who uses 26 27 telemedicine shall [interview] evaluate the patient, collect 28 or review the patient's relevant medical history, and perform an examination sufficient for the diagnosis and 29 treatment of the patient. [A] Any questionnaire completed 30 by the patient, whether via the internet or telephone, shall 31 32 include such information sufficient to provide the 33 information as though the medical evaluation has been 34 performed in person, otherwise such questionnaire does not 35 constitute an acceptable medical [interview] evaluation and examination for the provision of treatment by telehealth. 36

334.108. 1. Prior to prescribing any drug, controlled substance, or other treatment through telemedicine, as defined in section 191.1145, or the internet, a physician shall establish a valid physician-patient relationship as described in section 191.1146. This relationship shall include:

7 (1) Obtaining a reliable medical history and, if
8 required to meet the standard of care, performing a physical
9 examination of the patient, adequate to establish the
10 diagnosis for which the drug is being prescribed and to
11 identify underlying conditions or contraindications to the
12 treatment recommended or provided;

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Having sufficient [dialogue] exchange with the 13 (2) patient regarding treatment options and the risks and 14 15 benefits of treatment or treatments; If appropriate, following up with the patient to 16 (3)assess the therapeutic outcome; 17 Maintaining a contemporaneous medical record that 18 (4) 19 is readily available to the patient and, subject to the 20 patient's consent, to the patient's other health care 21 professionals; and 22 (5) Maintaining the electronic prescription information as part of the patient's medical record. 23 The requirements of subsection 1 of this section 24 2. 25 may be satisfied by the prescribing physician's designee when treatment is provided in: 26 27 A hospital as defined in section 197.020; (1)28 (2) A hospice program as defined in section 197.250; 29 (3) Home health services provided by a home health agency as defined in section 197.400; 30 31 (4) Accordance with a collaborative practice agreement as [defined] described in section 334.104; 32 (5) Conjunction with a physician assistant licensed 33 pursuant to section 334.738; 34 35 Conjunction with an assistant physician licensed (6) 36 under section 334.036; 37 (7) Consultation with another physician who has an 38 ongoing physician-patient relationship with the patient, and 39 who has agreed to supervise the patient's treatment, including use of any prescribed medications; or 40 (8) On-call or cross-coverage situations. 41 42 3. No health care provider, as defined in section 376.1350, shall prescribe any drug, controlled substance, or 43

other treatment to a patient based solely on an evaluation

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over the telephone; except that, a physician or such 45 physician's on-call designee, or an advanced practice 46 registered nurse, a physician assistant, or an assistant 47 physician in a collaborative practice arrangement with such 48 physician, may prescribe any drug, controlled substance, or 49 50 other treatment that is within his or her scope of practice to a patient based solely on a telephone evaluation if a 51 52 previously established and ongoing physician-patient 53 relationship exists between such physician and the patient being treated. 54

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4. No health care provider shall prescribe any drug,
controlled substance, or other treatment to a patient [based
solely on an internet request or an internet questionnaire]
in the absence of a proper provider-patient relationship, as
described in section 191.1146.

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
