## **AN ACT**

To repeal section 513.605, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof two new sections relating to illegal immigrants, with penalty provisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 513.605, RSMo, is repealed and two new

- 2 sections enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as sections
- 3 513.605 and 577.690, to read as follows:

513.605. As used in sections 513.600 to 513.645,

- 2 unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
- 3 following terms mean:
- 4 (1) (a) "Beneficial interest":
- 5 a. The interest of a person as a beneficiary under any
- 6 other trust arrangement pursuant to which a trustee holds
- 7 legal or record title to real property for the benefit of
- 8 such person; or
- 9 b. The interest of a person under any other form of
- 10 express fiduciary arrangement pursuant to which any other
- 11 person holds legal or record title to real property for the
- 12 benefit of such person;
- 13 (b) "Beneficial interest" does not include the
- 14 interest of a stockholder in a corporation or the interest
- 15 of a partner in either a general partnership or limited
- 16 partnership. A beneficial interest shall be deemed to be
- 17 located where the real property owned by the trustee is
- 18 located;

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"Civil proceeding", any civil suit commenced by an
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    investigative agency under any provision of sections 513.600
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    to 513.645;
          (3) "Criminal activity" is the commission, attempted
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    commission, conspiracy to commit, or the solicitation,
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    coercion or intimidation of another person to commit any
    crime which is chargeable by indictment or information under
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    the following Missouri laws:

- 55 (4) "Criminal proceeding", any criminal prosecution 56 commenced by an investigative agency under any criminal law 57 of this state;
- (5) "Investigative agency", the attorney general'soffice, or the office of any prosecuting attorney or circuitattorney;
- 61 (6) "Pecuniary value":
- 62 (a) Anything of value in the form of money, a
  63 negotiable instrument, a commercial interest, or anything
  64 else the primary significance of which is economic
  65 advantage; or
- 66 (b) Any other property or service that has a value in 67 excess of one hundred dollars;
- (7) "Real property", any estate or legal or equitable interest in land situated in this state or any interest in such real property, including, but not limited to, any lease or deed of trust upon such real property;
- 72 (8) "Seizing agency", the agency which is the primary
  73 employer of the officer or agent seizing the property,
  74 including any agency in which one or more of the employees
  75 acting on behalf of the seizing agency is employed by the
  76 state of Missouri or any political subdivision of this state;
- 77 (9) "Seizure", the point at which any law enforcement 78 officer or agent discovers and exercises any control over 79 property that an officer or agent has reason to believe was 80 used or intended for use in the course of, derived from, or 81 realized through criminal activity. Seizure includes but is 82 not limited to preventing anyone found in possession of the

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- 83 property from leaving the scene of the investigation while
- 84 in possession of the property;
- **85** (10) (a) "Trustee":
- a. Any person who holds legal or record title to real
- 87 property for which any other person has a beneficial
- 88 interest; or
- b. Any successor trustee or trustees to any of the
- 90 foregoing persons;
- 91 (b) "Trustee" does not include the following:
- 92 a. Any person appointed or acting as a personal
- 93 representative under chapter 475 or under chapter 473;
- 94 b. Any person appointed or acting as a trustee of any
- 95 testamentary trust or as trustee of any indenture of trust
- 96 under which any bonds are or are to be issued.
  - 577.690. 1. A person commits the offense of improper
  - 2 entry by an alien if the person enters this state at any
  - 3 time when the person is in violation of 8 U.S.C. Section
  - 4 1325.
  - 5 2. The offense of improper entry by an alien is
  - 6 punishable by a fine of one hundred thousand dollars and
  - 7 shall be subject to an order of removal, as provided
  - 8 pursuant to subsection 3 of this section.
  - 9 3. An order of removal shall include all of the
- 10 following:
- 11 (1) The manner of transportation of the person to a
- port of entry, as defined by 19 CFR Part 101; and
- 13 (2) The law enforcement officer or state agency
- 14 responsible for monitoring compliance with the order.
- 15 4. In lieu of continuing the prosecution of or
- 16 entering an adjudication regarding the offense of improper
- 17 entry, the court at any time after the person's appearance
- 18 may, upon request, dismiss the charge pending against the

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person and issue an order of removal, as provided in subsection 3 of this section.

- 5. The offense of improper entry by an alien shall be subject to the provisions of sections 513.600 to 513.645.
- 23 6. Any law enforcement officer whose duty it is to
  24 enforce criminal laws of this state may, upon probable cause
  25 that a person has violated subsection 1 of this section,
  26 arrest or detain such person in a manner consistent with
  27 chapter 544.

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
