AN ACT

To amend chapter 376, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to insurance coverage of alternatives to opioid drugs.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

	Section A. Chapter 376, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto
2	one new section, to be known as section 376.1280, to read as
3	follows:
	376.1280. 1. As used in this section, the following
2	terms mean:
3	(1) "Elevated risk of opioid misuse", when an enrollee
4	meets one or more of the following criteria, as determined
5	by the prescribing health care professional:
6	(a) Current or previous history or diagnosis of a
7	substance use disorder;
8	(b) Completed an advance healthcare directive to limit
9	pain control to non-opioid measures as described in section
10	459.016;
11	(c) Increased risk for opioid overdose, dependency, or
12	serious side effects based on the patient's age or
13	diagnosis; or
14	(d) Currently prescribed medications with
15	contraindications for opioid use;
16	(2) "Enrollee", the same meaning given to the term in
17	section 376.1350;

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(3) "Health benefit plan", the same meaning given to
 the term in section 376.1350;

20 (4) "Health care professional", the same meaning given
21 to the term in section 376.1350;

22 2. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the 23 contrary, when a licensed health care professional acting 24 within the scope of his or her license prescribes a non-25 opioid medication for the treatment of pain to a patient 26 with elevated risk of opioid misuse, it shall be unlawful 27 for a health benefit plan to:

(1) Deny coverage of the non-opioid prescription drug
 in favor of an opioid prescription drug;

30 (2) Require the patient to try an opioid prescription
 31 drug prior to providing coverage of the non-opioid
 32 prescription drug; or

33 (3) Require a higher level of cost-sharing for the non 34 opioid prescription drug than for an opioid prescription
 35 drug.

36 3. No health benefit plan shall require a health care 37 professional or enrollee to submit documentation beyond the 38 prescribing health care professional's clinical notes to 39 determine whether an enrollee meets the criteria for 40 elevated risk of opioid misuse.

4. This section shall apply to health benefit plans 42 delivered, issued for delivery, continued, or renewed on or 43 after January 1, 2026.
