AN ACT

To amend chapter 71, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to permits for development of real property from political subdivisions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

	Section A. Chapter 71, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto
2	one new section, to be known as section 71.295, to read as
3	follows:
	71.295. 1. For the purposes of this section,
2	"request" shall mean an application to a political
3	subdivision for a permit, license, variance, or any other
4	type of prior approval from a political subdivision for an
5	action related to the development or improvement of property.
6	2. If an applicant submits a request to a political
7	subdivision, then the political subdivision shall approve or
8	deny the applicant's request within sixty days.
9	(1) If the political subdivision fails to approve or
10	deny the applicant's request within sixty days, then the
11	request is approved.
12	(2) The time limit in this subsection begins upon the
13	political subdivision's receipt of a request from an
14	applicant.
15	(3) If the political subdivision approves the request,
16	then the political subdivision may not impose on the
17	applicant any additional requirements related to the request.

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18 (4) If the political subdivision denies the request, 19 then the political subdivision shall provide the applicant a 20 statement in writing of the reasons for the denial. 21 If a political subdivision denies a request for (5) being incomplete, then the political subdivision shall 22 23 provide the applicant a statement in writing of the reasons the request is incomplete. The request is incomplete if it 24 25 fails to contain all information required by law or by a 26 previously adopted rule, ordinance, or policy of the 27 political subdivision. The time limit in subsection 2 of this section may 28 3. be extended if: 29

30 (1) A request requires prior approval of a state or
31 federal agency, then the deadline shall be extended to sixty
32 days after the required prior approval is granted. The
33 extension shall not exceed sixty days, unless agreed to by
34 the applicant; or

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(2) The applicant requests an extension in writing.

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
