AN ACT

To repeal section 192.769, RSMo, relating to mammograms.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 192.769, RSMo, is repealed, to read as follows:

2 follows:

3 [192.769. 1. On completion of a

4 mammogram, a mammography facility certified by

5 the United States Food and Drug Administration

6 (FDA) or by a certification agency approved by

7 the FDA shall provide to the patient the

8 following notice:

9 "If your mammogram demonstrates that you

10 have dense breast tissue, which could hide

11 abnormalities, and you have other risk factors

12 for breast cancer that have been identified, you

13 might benefit from supplemental screening tests

14 that may be suggested by your ordering

15 physician. Dense breast tissue, in and of

16 itself, is a relatively common condition.

17 Therefore, this information is not provided to

18 cause undue concern, but rather to raise your

19 awareness and to promote discussion with your

20 physician regarding the presence of other risk

21 factors, in addition to dense breast tissue. A

22 report of your mammography results will be sent

23 to you and your physician. You should contact

24 your physician if you have any questions or

25 concerns regarding this report."

26 2. Nothing in this section shall be

27 construed to create a duty of care beyond the

duty to provide notice as set forth in this

section.

29 section or evidence that a person violated this
30 section is not admissible in a civil, judicial,
31 or administrative proceeding.

32 4. A mammography facility is not required
33 to comply with the requirements of this section
34 until January 1, 2015.]
