AN ACT

To amend chapter 386, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to electric service interruption.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

	Section A. Chapter 386, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto
2	one new section, to be known as section 386.1000, to read as
3	follows:
	386.1000. 1. As used in this section, the following
2	terms mean:
3	(1) "Commission", the Missouri Public Service
4	Commission;
5	(2) "Electric service interruption", an interruption
6	in electric service to a customer if such electric service
7	interruption was not caused by a customer;
8	(3) "Electric utility", an electrical corporation as
9	defined by section 386.020;
10	(4) "Loss", any financial loss a customer incurs as a
11	result of an electric service interruption, including but
12	not limited to food, medicine, or any other good;
13	(5) "Rate", the same as in section 386.020.
14	2. Whenever an electric service interruption occurs
15	that lasts for more than forty-eight hours, and a customer
16	incurs a loss as a result of such electric service
17	interruption, an electric utility shall reimburse the
18	customer for the loss from the electric service interruption.

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3. An electric utility shall create a form for loss
recovery and make the form available on the electric
utility's website.

4. If a loss is greater than two hundred dollars, a customer shall submit receipts or any relevant documents for such loss with the form as provided in subsection 3 of this section to the electric utility before being reimbursed for the loss by the electric utility.

27 5. The commission shall require an electric utility to 28 maintain a record detailing each instance a transmission of 29 electricity is less than fifty percent of the standard voltage or whenever an electric service interruption affects 30 more than ten customers. The record shall not include 31 32 disconnection of service to customers for good cause. The 33 record shall include:

34 (1) Date, time, and duration of an electric service
 35 interruption;

36 (2) Number of customers affected by an electric
 37 service interruption;

38 (3) Description of the cause of an electric service
 39 interruption, including any equipment involved in the
 40 electric service interruption if applicable;

41 (4) The geographic area of an electric service
42 interruption;

43 (5) Measures taken by an electric utility to restore
44 electric service;

45 (6) Measures taken by an electric utility to prevent
 46 future electric service interruptions; and

47 (7) Amounts paid by an electric utility to affected
48 customers for any loss incurred as a result of an electric
49 service interruption.

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50 6. Copies of any records detailing the information 51 required in subsection 5 of this section shall be made 52 public by an electric utility on the electric utility's 53 website.

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The commission shall promulgate rules to ensure 54 7. 55 compliance with provisions of this section. Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 56 536.010, that is created under the authority delegated in 57 58 this section shall become effective only if it complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, 59 if applicable, section 536.028. This section and chapter 60 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with 61 the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to 62 delay the effective date, or to disapprove and annul a rule 63 64 are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the grant of 65 rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after 66 August 28, 2025, shall be invalid and void.

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
