## **AN ACT**

To repeal sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof three new sections relating to absentee voting.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, RSMo,

- 2 are repealed and three new sections enacted in lieu thereof, to
- 3 be known as sections 115.277, 115.279, and 115.283, to read as
- 4 follows:
  - 115.277. 1. A registered voter of this state may cast
- 2 an absentee ballot in person at a location designated by the
- 3 election authority for all candidates and issues for which
- 4 such voter is eligible to vote at the polling place [if such
- voter expects to be prevented from going to the polls to
- 6 vote on election day due to one of the reasons listed in
- 7 subsection 3 of this section]. A registered voter casting a
- 8 ballot under the provisions of this subsection shall provide
- 9 a form of personal photo identification that is consistent
- 10 with subsection 1 of section 115.427. [Beginning on the
- 11 second Tuesday prior to an election, a reason listed under
- subsection 3 of this section shall not be required, provided
- that, the provisions of section 1.140 to the contrary
- notwithstanding, this sentence and section 115.427 shall be
- nonseverable, and if any provision of section 115.427 is for
- any reason held to be invalid, such decision shall
- invalidate this sentence.]

EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

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Except as provided in subsections 3, 4, and 5[, and
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    6] of this section, a registered voter of this state may
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    cast an absentee ballot not in person at a location
    designated by the election authority for all candidates and
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    issues for which such voter [would be] is eligible to vote
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    at the polling place [if such voter expects to be prevented
    from going to the polls to vote on election day due to one
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    of the reasons listed in subsection 3 of this section.
    absentee ballot that is not requested and completed in
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    person at the office of the election authority with a form
    of personal photo identification that is consistent with
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    subsection 1 of section 115.427 shall have the statement on
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    the ballot envelope notarized as required under section
    115.283, except that absentee ballots requested under
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    subdivisions (2) and (5) of subsection 3 of this section
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    shall not require notarization. This subsection shall apply
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    only in the case of absentee ballots that are not cast in
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    person].

  - 4.] Any covered voter who is eligible to register and vote in this state may vote in any election for federal office, statewide office, state legislative office, or statewide ballot initiatives by submitting a federal postcard application to apply to vote by absentee ballot or by submitting a federal postcard application at the polling place even though the person is not registered. A federal postcard application submitted by a covered voter pursuant to this subsection shall also serve as a voter registration application under section 115.908 and the election authority shall, if satisfied that the applicant is entitled to register, place the voter's name on the voter registration file. Each covered voter may vote by absentee ballot or, upon submitting an affidavit that the person is qualified to vote in the election, may vote at the person's polling place.
- 74 [5.] 4. Any interstate former resident may vote by 75 absentee ballot for presidential and vice presidential 76 electors.
- 77 [6.] 5. Any new resident may vote by absentee ballot 78 for presidential and vice presidential electors after

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79 registering to vote in such resident's new jurisdiction of 80 residence.

115.279. 1. Application for an absentee ballot may be made by the applicant in person, or by mail, or for the applicant, in person, by his or her guardian or a relative within the second degree by consanguinity or affinity. The election authority shall accept applications by facsimile transmission and by electronic mail within the limits of its telecommunications capacity.

- 2. Notwithstanding section 115.284, no individual, group, or party shall solicit a voter into obtaining an absentee ballot application. Absentee ballot applications shall not have the information prefilled prior to [it] being provided to a voter. Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to prohibit a state or local election authority from assisting an individual voter.
- 15 3. Each application shall be made to the election 16 authority of the jurisdiction in which the person is or 17 would be registered. Each application shall be in writing and shall state the applicant's name, address at which he or 18 19 she is or would be registered, [his or her reason for voting an absentee ballot, ] the address to which the ballot is to 20 be mailed, if mailing is requested, and for absent uniformed 21 22 services and overseas applicants, the applicant's email address if electronic transmission is requested. 23 [reason for the applicant voting absentee is due to the 24 reasons established under subdivision (6) of subsection 3 of 25 section 115.277] applicant is a certified participant in the 26 address confidentiality program established under sections 27 28 589.660 to 589.681, the applicant shall state the voter's identification information provided by the address 29 confidentiality program in lieu of the applicant's name, 30

31 address at which he or she is or would be registered, and 32 address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if mailing is 33 requested. Each application to vote in a primary election shall also state which ballot the applicant wishes to 34 receive. If any application fails to designate a ballot, 35 the election authority shall, within three working days 36 after receiving the application, notify the applicant by 37 38 mail that it will be unable to deliver an absentee ballot until the applicant designates which political party ballot 39 40 he or she wishes to receive. If the applicant does not respond to the request for political party designation, the 41 election authority is authorized to provide the voter with 42 43 that part of the ballot for which no political party designation is required. 44

- All applications for absentee ballots received 45 prior to the sixth Tuesday before an election shall be 46 47 stored at the office of the election authority until such time as the applications are processed in accordance with 48 49 section 115.281. No application for an absentee ballot received in the office of the election authority by mail, by 50 facsimile transmission, by electronic mail, or by a guardian 51 or relative after 5:00 p.m. on the second Wednesday 52 immediately prior to the election shall be accepted by any 53 election authority. No application for an absentee ballot 54 submitted by the applicant in person after 5:00 p.m. on the 55 56 day before the election shall be accepted by any election 57 authority, except as provided in subsections 7, 8, and 9 of this section. 58
- 5. Each application for an absentee ballot shall be 60 signed by the applicant or, if the application is made by a 61 guardian or relative pursuant to this section, the 62 application shall be signed by the guardian or relative, who

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63 shall note on the application his or her relationship to the applicant. If an applicant, quardian or relative is blind, 64 65 unable to read or write the English language or physically incapable of signing the application, he or she shall sign 66 by mark, witnessed by the signature of an election official 67 or person of his or her own choosing. Any person who 68 knowingly makes, delivers or mails a fraudulent absentee 69 70 ballot application shall be quilty of a class one election 71 offense.

- 6. (1) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, any resident of the state of Missouri who resides outside the boundaries of the United States or who is on active duty with the Armed Forces of the United States or members of their immediate family living with them may request an absentee ballot for both the primary and subsequent general election with one application.
- 79 (2) The election authority shall provide each absent 80 uniformed services voter and each overseas voter who submits 81 a voter registration application or an absentee ballot 82 request, if the election authority rejects the application 83 or request, with the reasons for the rejection.
- (3) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, if a standard oath regarding material misstatements of fact is adopted for uniformed and overseas voters pursuant to the Help America Vote Act of 2002, the election authority shall accept such oath for voter registration, absentee ballot, or other election-related materials.
- 90 (4) Not later than sixty days after the date of each 91 regularly scheduled general election for federal office, 92 each election authority which administered the election 93 shall submit to the secretary of state in a format 94 prescribed by the secretary a report on the combined number

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95 of absentee ballots transmitted to, and returned by, absent uniformed services voters and overseas voters for the 96 97 election. The secretary shall submit to the Election Assistance Commission a combined report of such information 98 99 not later than ninety days after the date of each regularly 100 scheduled general election for federal office and in a standardized format developed by the commission pursuant to 101 102 the Help America Vote Act of 2002. The secretary shall make 103 the report available to the general public.

- (5) As used in this section, the terms "absent uniformed services voter" and "overseas voter" shall have the meaning prescribed in 52 U.S.C. Section 20310.
- 107 An application for an absentee ballot by a new resident shall be submitted in person by the applicant in 108 the office of the election authority in the election 109 110 jurisdiction in which such applicant resides. application shall be received by the election authority no 111 112 later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election. 113 application shall be in the form of an affidavit, executed in duplicate in the presence of the election authority or 114 any authorized officer of the election authority, and in 115 substantially the following form: 116



later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of the election.
