AN ACT

To repeal section 313.230, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof one new section relating to games offered by the state lottery.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Section 313.230, RSMo, is repealed and one new
2 section enacted in lieu thereof, to be known as section 313.230,
3 to read as follows:

313.230. The commission shall:

2 (1) Issue rules and regulations concerning the
3 operation of the Missouri state lottery. The rules and
4 regulations shall include, but shall not be limited to, the
5 following:

6 (a) The type of lottery to be conducted, except no
7 lottery may use any coin- or token-operated amusement device
8 [and no lottery game shall be based in any form on the
9 outcome of sporting events]. However, it shall be legal to
10 use clerk- or player-activated terminals, which are coin- or
11 currency-operated, to dispense lottery tickets;

12 (b) The price, or prices, of tickets or shares in the
13 lottery;

14 (c) The numbers and sizes of the prizes on the winning
15 tickets or shares;

16 (d) The manner of selecting the winning tickets or
17 shares;

EXPLANATION-Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in this bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted in the law.

18 (e) The manner of payment of prizes to the holders of
19 winning tickets or shares;

20 (f) The frequency of the drawings or selections of
21 winning tickets or shares, without limitation;

22 (g) The types or numbers of locations at which tickets
23 or shares may be sold and the method to be used in selling
24 tickets or shares;

25 (h) The method to be used in selling tickets or shares;

26 (i) The licensing of lottery game retailers to sell
27 tickets or shares;

28 (j) The manner and amount of compensation, including
29 commissions, ticket discounts, incentives and any other
30 remuneration, to be paid to or retained by lottery game
31 retailers;

32 (k) The apportionment of the total revenues accruing
33 from the sale of lottery tickets or shares and from all
34 other sources among:

35 a. The payment of prizes to the holders of winning
36 tickets or shares;

37 b. The payment of costs incurred in the operation and
38 administration of the lottery, including the expenses of the
39 commission and the costs resulting from any contract or
40 contracts entered into for promotional, advertising or
41 operational services or for the purchase or lease of lottery
42 equipment and materials;

43 c. For the repayment to the general revenue fund of
44 any amount appropriated for initial start-up of the lottery;
45 and

46 d. For timely transfer to the state lottery fund as
47 provided by law;

48 (l) Such other matters necessary or desirable for the
49 efficient and economical operation and administration of the

50 lottery and for the convenience of the purchasers of tickets
51 or shares and the holders of winning tickets or shares. The
52 commission may disburse money for payment of lottery prizes;

53 (2) Amend, repeal, or supplement any such rules and
54 regulations from time to time as it deems necessary or
55 desirable;

56 (3) Advise and make recommendations to the director
57 regarding the operation and administration of the lottery;

58 (4) Report quarterly to the governor and the general
59 assembly the total lottery revenues, prize disbursements and
60 other expenses for the preceding quarter, and to make an
61 annual report, which shall include a full and complete
62 statement of lottery revenues, prize disbursements and other
63 expenses, to the governor and the general assembly, and
64 including such recommendations for changes in sections
65 313.200 to 313.350 as it deems necessary or desirable;

66 (5) Report to the governor and general assembly any
67 matters which shall require immediate changes in the laws of
68 this state in order to prevent abuses and evasions of
69 sections 313.200 to 313.350 or rules and regulations
70 promulgated thereunder or to rectify undesirable conditions
71 in connection with the administration or operation of the
72 lottery;

73 (6) Carry on a continuous study and investigation of
74 the lottery throughout the state and to make a continuous
75 study and investigation of the operation and the
76 administration of similar laws which may be in effect in
77 other states or countries, any literature on the subject
78 which from time to time may be published or available, any
79 federal laws which may affect the operation of the lottery,
80 and the reaction of Missouri citizens to existing and
81 potential features of the lottery with a view to

82 recommending or effecting changes that will tend to serve
83 the purposes of sections 313.200 to 313.350;

84 (7) Ensure that all employees of the state lottery
85 commission hired after July 12, 1990, shall not be related
86 to any member of the state lottery commission or any
87 employee of the state lottery commission within the third
88 degree of consanguinity or affinity.

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
