JOINT RESOLUTION

Submitting to the qualified voters of Missouri, an amendment repealing section 26 of article X of the Constitution of Missouri, and adopting one new section in lieu thereof relating to sales tax.

Be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring therein:

	That at the next general election to be held in the

[Section 26. In order to prohibit an increase in the tax burden on the citizens of Missouri, state and local sales and use taxes (or any similar transaction-based tax) shall not be expanded to impose taxes on any service or transaction that was not subject to sales, use or similar transaction-based tax on January 1, 2015.]

Section B. Pursuant to chapter 116, and other applicable constitutional provisions and laws of this state allowing the general assembly to adopt ballot language for the submission of this joint resolution to the voters of this state, the official summary statement of this resolution shall be as follows:

7 "Shall the Missouri Constitution be amended to:
8 • Limit the statutory statewide sales tax rate
9 to 3.775%; and

Allow for a statewide sales tax on lobbying
services at a rate of 6%?".
