An Act to repeal section 195.010, RSMo, and to enact in lieu thereof four new sections relating to cannabis, with penalty provisions.

Senator Gregory (15) moved that **SS** for **HCS** for **HB 2641** be adopted.

Senator Carter offered **SA 1**:

SENATE AMENDMENT NO. 1

Amend Senate Substitute for House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 2641, Page 17, Section 195.819, by striking all of said section and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

“195.819. Marijuana dispensary facilities, as described in Article XIV of the Constitution of Missouri, shall not create or retain any record containing the consumer's identifying information; provided, that a facility may create or retain such records if the consumer affirmatively agrees to such, in writing, and if the facility does not refuse to provide services or sell goods to the consumer if he or she does not agree to the creation or retention of such records. The provisions of this section shall not apply to any record-keeping requirements relating to qualifying patients and primary caregivers under Article XIV, Section 1 of the Constitution of Missouri. Any dispensary facility that violates the provisions of this section shall be assessed a five-hundred-dollar fine per occurrence.”.

Senator Carter moved that the above amendment be adopted, which motion prevailed.

Senator May offered **SA 2**:

SENATE AMENDMENT NO. 2

Amend Senate Substitute for House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 2641, Page 1, In the Title, Line 4, by inserting after “provisions” the following: “and an effective date”; and

Further amend said bill, page 24, section 195.900, line 215, by inserting after all of said line the following:

“Section B. The enactment of sections 195.800, 195.819 and 195.900 and the repeal and reenactment of section 195.010 shall become effective on November 12, 2026.”.

Senator May moved that the above amendment be adopted, which motion prevailed.

Senator Webber offered **SA 3**:

SENATE AMENDMENT NO. 3

Amend Senate Substitute for House Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 2641, Page 24, Section 195.900, Line 215, by inserting after all of said line the following:

“Section 1. All persons employed in cannabis-related businesses in this state, including cultivation, processing, manufacturing, distribution, retail, and support operations, shall have the right to organize, form, join, and assist labor organizations and to bargain collectively with their employers through representatives of their own choosing. Cannabis industry employment, including work in climate-controlled indoor cultivation and processing facilities, is not “agricultural labor” as used for purposes of exemptions from collective bargaining and shall be treated as covered employment under Missouri's collective bargaining protections.”; and

Further amend the title and enacting clause accordingly.

Senator Webber moved that the above amendment be adopted, which motion prevailed.

Senator Burger assumed the Chair.

Senator Gregory (15) moved that **SS** for **HCS** for **HB 2641**, as amended, be adopted, which motion prevailed.

On motion of Senator Gregory (15), **SS** for **HCS** for **HB 2641**, as amended, was read the 3rd time and passed by the following vote:
