ASSUMPTION

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

DESCRIPTION

Current law requires superintendents to convene hearings in order to determine whether certain students may be enrolled in the district. The hearings must occur within five working days of the request to register. This proposal changes the aforementioned provision so that districts must convene such hearings within fifteen working days of the request to register.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
