ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Corrections, and the Office of Attorney General**, stated this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume there will be no fiscal impact on the Courts.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** stated there would be no significant direct fiscal impact on county prosecutors.

Officials from the **State Public Defender**, in response to the introduced version of this proposal, stated this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

Officials from the **Sikeston and Kansas City School Districts** indicate this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their districts, while officials from the **Columbia School District** state this proposal would have minimal fiscal impact.

DESCRIPTION

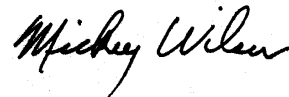
Current law requires superintendents or their designee to convene hearings in order to determine whether certain students may be enrolled in the district. The hearings must occur within five working days of the request to register. This proposal changes the aforementioned provision so that such hearings must be convened within fifteen working days of the request to register. Also, this proposal would allow districts to appoint a committee of their board in order to rule on such residency waiver requests.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
