FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Department of Corrections,** and the **Office of Attorney General,** stated this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials from the **Office of State Courts Administrator** assume there will be no fiscal impact on the Courts.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services,** in the perfected version of this proposal, stated there would be no significant direct fiscal impact on county prosecutors.

Officials from the **State Public Defender,** stated this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agency.

In response to the perfected version of this proposal, officials from the **Sikeston and Kansas City School Districts** indicate this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their districts, while officials from the **Columbia School District** state this proposal would have minimal fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

Current law requires district boards to convene a hearing in order to determine whether a pupil shall be granted a waiver of certain registration requirements. This proposal would allow districts to convene a committee of their board in order to rule on such residency waiver requests.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
