FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Boone County Sheriff's Department** state their department presently has its sex offender registry online. A one-time labor expenditure would be realized for them to add photos to the web page. Boone County estimates approximately 16 hours of labor at \$20 per hour would be involved to add the approximately 180 photographs to the web page. The estimated cost would be a one-time expenditure of \$320.

Oversight assumes the proposal is permissive and would have no fiscal impact. However, if the chief law enforcement officer of the county elects to establish a searchable registered sexual offender web page on the Internet, the county may experience a fiscal impact. Since the language is permissive, Oversight assumes no impact.

Officials from the Greene County Sheriff's Office, Jackson County Sheriff's Office, and St. Louis County Police Department did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

The proposal would allow the chief law enforcement officer of a county to maintain a searchable sexual offender registry website on the Internet. The name of the offender, the last known address of the offender, a photograph of the offender, and the crime or crimes for which the offender was convicted that caused him or her to have to register would be provided to the public in the registered sexual offender search.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
