ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Social Services- Children's Division (DOS-CD)** state this proposal requires that DOS-CD provide incremental increase of the foster care reimbursement rate and the adoption subsidy rate beginning in the 2006 fiscal year. Both rates shall be increased until they meet or exceed rates established by the United States Department of Agriculture.

FY 06 is for only 10 months (83.3%) of the full year cost.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal requires the incremental increase of the foster care reimbursement rate and the adoption subsidy rate over four years beginning in the 2006 fiscal year. Both rates shall be increased until they meet or exceed rates established by the United States Department of Agriculture.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
