FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

DESCRIPTION

This act would allow state employees, certified by volunteer agencies with a disaster service commitment recognized by the state emergency management agency, to be granted leave with pay while acting as a disaster service volunteer.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
