FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri Ethics Commission, Missouri Senate, Platte County Board of Elections** and **Kansas City Elections Board** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives** assume the any costs incurred as a result of this proposal would be absorbed with current House resources.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS) - Elections Division** state statewide newspaper publication of state statutes cost approximately \$1,289 per column inch based on an estimate provided by the Missouri Press Service times 3 for multiple printings, as required by the Constitution and state statute, or \$3,867 (\$1,289 X 3) per column inch. The estimate of the total number of inches required for this amendment is 10 inches, which includes title header and certification paragraph. Therefore, the total cost is anticipated to be \$38,670 (\$3,867 X 10 inches). These costs are based on 2004 figures and are subject to change.

Officials from the **St. Louis City Board of Elections, Jackson County Election Board,** and **St. Louis County Board of Elections** did not respond to our request for a statement of fiscal impact.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight assumes, based on the responses from other elections boards, the proposal would not fiscally impact the St. Louis City Board of Elections, Jackson County Election Board or the St. Louis County Board of Elections.

DESCRIPTION


This proposed constitutional amendment, if approved by the voters, changes the minimum age requirement for state representatives from 24 to 21 and the minimum age requirement for state senators from 30 to 25.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
