FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of Administration (COA) - Division of Budget and Planning, COA - Division of Personnel, Department of Insurance, Missouri House of Representatives and Missouri Senate assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **COA** - **Division of Accounting** defer to the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan for response regarding the fiscal impact of the proposal.

Officials from the **Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan (HCP)** state the proposal could create an approximate savings of \$825,000 for FY 06. This estimate is based upon the per person cost included in the appropriations request for FY 06 multiplied by the number of senators and representatives currently covered. Currently, HCP covers 125 state senators and representatives. This response also assumes that all members currently covered will continue coverage in 2006 and no new members will be included next year.

DESCRIPTION

This proposal prohibits state senators and representatives from receiving state health insurance. The proposal includes a delayed effective date, which makes the proposal effective January 1, 2006, the same time that the insurance policies are renewed.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
