## **FISCAL ANALYSIS**

#### **ASSUMPTION**

According to the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE),** currently 35 of 524 public school districts have greater than 5,000 students. 32 of the 35 districts are currently classified as accredited. This would average out to a savings of 6 school district MSI reviews per school year in a five-year MSI review cycle. The savings attributable would be minimal.

DESE assumes there would be unknown costs to school districts to develop a "valid scientific method" to determine if students are performing at reasonable rates.

Officials from the **Springfield**, **Parkway**, and **Columbia School Districts** indicated there would be no fiscal impact due to this proposal.

For fiscal note purposes only, based on responses from school districts and minimal savings assumed by DESE, **Oversight** is not showing any fiscal impact of this proposal.

The Lee's Summit School District did not respond to our request for fiscal note.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal permits fully accredited school districts with more than 5,000 students to obtain a waiver from the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education permitting the district to choose its own accreditation standards if the district has maintained five consecutive years of full accreditation under state standards and can demonstrate through valid methods that its students are attaining reasonable standards. This waiver procedure supersedes other waiver rules.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
