#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

## **DESCRIPTION**

This proposal changes the laws regarding the reporting of child abuse and neglect. The Children's Division of the Department of Social Services is required to expunge identifying information from reports by mandatory and all other reporters that has been found to be malicious, for purposes of harassment or retaliation, within 45 days after the conclusion of the investigation.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
