FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials with the **Department of Economic Development, Department of Public Safety, Office of Prosecution Services, Office of State Courts Administrator, and State Public Defender's Office** assume this proposal would have no fiscal impact on their agencies.

Officials with the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume this proposal will require procedural changes, notification to dealers and a form modification. DOR assumes it can utilize existing resources to implement this proposal.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** assume the proposal may result in the Attorney General's Office rescinding, amending, or promulgating rules to implement the provisions of this act. These rules would be published in the Missouri Register and the Code of State Regulations. These rules could require as many as 6 pages in the Code of State Regulations and half again as many pages in the Missouri Register, as cost statements, fiscal notes, and the like are not repeated in the Code. The estimated cost of a page in the Missouri Register is \$23 and the estimated cost of a page in the Code of State Regulations is \$27. Based on these costs, ASSUMPTION (continued)

the estimated cost of the proposal is \$369 in FY 06 and unknown in subsequent years. The

actual cost could be more or less than the numbers given. The impact of this legislation in future years is unknown and depends upon the frequency and length of rules filed, amended, rescinded, or withdrawn.

Oversight assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which would require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

DESCRIPTION


This proposal allows vehicle dealers to buy and sell vehicles without contemporaneous exchange of titles.
