FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials of the **Department of Health and Senior Services** assume since training to qualify for state registration is covered by fees charged for the course, there would be a zero net fiscal impact.

Officials of the **Department of Natural Resources** stated that in the original legislation the Environmental Services Program would have needed to license labs that analyze wastewater treatment facilities. This would have required additional staff and expenses. Fees generated to for this service would have been deposited in General Revenue as the law did not specify the fund where fees would be deposited. The program was supposed to recover all cost through billings. For purposes of this fiscal note, since no cost for this program was reflected in the FY 2006 budget, no cost savings would be realized by the repeal. Officials assume no fiscal impact.

Officials of the **Office of Attorney General** assume no fiscal impact.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

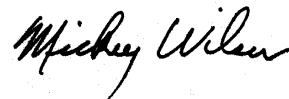
DESCRIPTION

This act repeals HS/HCS/HB 1433 (2004) authorizing the creation of watershed improvement districts.
